15 SECTION 2. (a) The change in law made by this Act applies 16 only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this 17 Act. For purposes of this section, an offense is committed before 18 the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurs 19 before that date.

(b) An offense committed before the effective date of this
Act is covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed,
and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
