## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

## AN ACT

2 relating to a project of a development corporation in connection 3 with a military base or facility.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 2(11), Development Corporation Act of 6 1979 (Article 5190.6, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes), is amended 7 to read as follows:

(11) [(A)] "Project" shall mean the land, buildings, 8 equipment, facilities, expenditures, targeted infrastructure, and 9 improvements (one or more) that are for the creation or retention of 10 primary jobs and that are found by the board of directors to be 11 12 required or suitable for the development, retention, or expansion 13 manufacturing and industrial facilities, research of and development facilities, military facilities, including closed or 14 realigned military bases, transportation facilities (including but 15 not limited to airports, ports, mass commuting facilities, and 16 parking facilities), sewage or solid waste disposal facilities, 17 recycling facilities, air or water pollution control facilities, 18 facilities for the furnishing of water to the general public, 19 distribution centers, small warehouse facilities capable of 20 21 serving as decentralized storage and distribution centers, primary job training facilities for use by institutions of higher 22 23 education, and regional or national corporate headquarters facilities. 24

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"Project" also includes job training required or suitable for the promotion of development and expansion of business enterprises and other enterprises described by this Act, as provided by Section 38 of this Act.

5 "Project" also includes expenditures found by the board 6 of directors to be required or suitable for infrastructure 7 necessary to promote or develop new or expanded business 8 enterprises limited to streets and roads, rail spurs, water and electric related 9 utilities, gas utilities, drainage and improvements, and telecommunications and Internet improvements. 10

11"Project" also includes the infrastructure,12improvements, land acquisition, buildings, or expenditures that:13(A) are for the creation or retention of primary14jobs or jobs that are included in North American Industry15Classification System (NAICS) sector number 926120, Regulation and16Administration of Transportation Programs, for the corresponding17index entry for Coast Guard (except academy); and

18 (B) are found by the board of directors to be 19 required or suitable for:

20 <u>(i) promoting or supporting a military base</u> 21 <u>in active use to prevent the possible future closure or realignment</u> 22 <u>of the base;</u>

23 (ii) attracting new military missions to a 24 military base in active use; or 25 (iii) redeveloping a military base that has 26 been closed or realigned, including a military base closed or 27 realigned according to the recommendation of the Defense Base

Section 2(17), Development Corporation Act of 3 4 1979 (Article 5190.6, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes), is amended to 5 read as follows: 6 (17) "Primary job" means: 7 (A) a job that is: 8 (i) [(A)] available at a company for which 9 a majority of the products or services of that company are ultimately exported to regional, statewide, national, 10 or international markets infusing new dollars into the local economy; 11 12 and (ii) [<del>(B)</del>] included in one of the following 13 14 sectors of the North American Industry Classification System 15 (NAICS): 16 NAICS Sector # Description 17 111 Crop Production Animal Production 112 18 19 113 Forestry and Logging 11411 Commercial Fishing 20 21 115 Support Activities for Agriculture and Forestry 22 211-213 23 Mining Utilities 24 221 311-339 25 Manufacturing Wholesale Trade 26 42 48-49 Transportation and Warehousing 27

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51 (excluding 512131 Information (excluding movie theaters and 1 2 and 512132) drive-in theaters) 3 Securities, Commodity Contracts, and Other 523-525 4 Financial Investments and Related 5 Activities; Insurance Carriers and Related 6 Activities; Funds, Trusts, and Other 7 Financial Vehicles 8 5413, 5415, 5416, Scientific Research and Development Services 5417, and 5419 9 10 551 Management of Companies and Enterprises 922140 Correctional Institutions; or 11 (B) a job that is included in North American 12 Industry Classification System (NAICS) sector number 928110, 13 National Security, for the corresponding index entries for Armed 14 15 Forces, Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, and Military Bases. SECTION 3. Section 23(b), Development Corporation Act of 16 17 1979 (Article 5190.6, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes), is amended to read as follows: 18 The corporation shall not have the power to own or 19 (b) operate any project as a business other than as lessor, seller, or 20 21 lender or pursuant to the requirements of any trust agreement

securing the credit transaction. Accordingly, the user pursuant to any lease, sale, or loan agreement relating to a project shall be considered to be the owner of the project for the purposes of the application of any ad valorem, sales, and use taxes or any other taxes levied or imposed by this state or any political subdivision of this state. The purchase and holding of mortgages, deeds of

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trust, or other security interests and contracting for any 1 2 servicing thereof shall not be deemed the operation of a project. 3 The corporation shall, however, have all powers necessary to own 4 and operate a project as a business if the project is a military installation or military facility that has been closed or 5 6 realigned, including a military installation or facility closed or realigned pursuant to the Defense Base Closure and Realignment Act 7 of 1990 (10 U.S.C. Section 2687 note) as amended. 8

9 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
