A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2	relating to use of the term "meteorologist"; creating an offense.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 12, Occupations Code, is
5	amended by adding Chapter 1959 to read as follows:
6	CHAPTER 1959. METEOROLOGISTS
7	Sec. 1959.001. USE OF TERM "METEOROLOGIST." (a) Except as
8	provided by Subsection (b), a person may not represent to others
9	that the person is a meteorologist or use the term "meteorologist"
10	to describe the person on a television or radio broadcast in this
11	state or in any other print or electronic media produced in this
12	state unless that person has graduated from a course of study in an
13	accredited degree program in meteorology, atmospheric science, or
14	other natural science that includes:
15	(1) at least 24 semester hours of credit in
16	meteorology or atmospheric science, including at least:
17	(A) six semester credit hours of course work in
18	atmospheric dynamics and thermodynamics;
19	(B) six semester credit hours of course work in
20	analysis and prediction of weather systems (synoptic/mesoscale);
21	<u>and</u>
22	(C) three semester credit hours of course work in
23	physical meteorology;
24	(2) six semester credit hours of course work in

1	physics, with at least one course that includes laboratory
2	sessions;
3	(3) three semester credit hours of course work in
4	ordinary differential equations; and
5	(4) at least nine semester credit hours of course work
6	appropriate for a physical science major in any combination of at
7	<pre>least three of the following subjects:</pre>
8	(A) physical hydrology;
9	(B) statistics;
10	(C) chemistry;
11	(D) physical oceanography;
12	(E) physical climatology;
13	(F) radiative transfer;
14	(G) aeronomy;
15	(H) advanced thermodynamics;
16	(I) advanced electricity and magnetism;
17	(J) light and optics; and
18	(K) computer science.
19	(b) Subsection (a) does not apply to a representation by a
20	person who has received training substantially equivalent to the
21	course of study described by Subsection (a) while serving as a
22	member of the United States armed forces.
23	(c) A person commits an offense if the person violates this
24	section. An offense under this section is a Class C misdemeanor.
25	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
