- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 43.033, Local Government Code, is
- 6 amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (c) to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (a) A general-law municipality may annex adjacent territory
- 9 without the consent of any of the residents or voters of the area
- 10 and without the consent of any of the owners of land in the area
- 11 provided that the following conditions are met:
- 12 (1) the municipality has a population of 1,000 or more
- and is not eligible to adopt a home-rule charter;
- 14 (2) the procedural rules prescribed by this chapter
- 15 are met;
- 16 (3) the municipality or another governmental entity is
- 17 [must be] providing the area with water or sewer service;
- 18 (4) the area does not include unoccupied territory in
- 19 excess of:
- 20 <u>(A)</u> one acre for each service address for water
- 21 and sewer service; or
- 22 (B) five acres for each service address for water
- 23 and sewer service, if the municipality has a population of less than
- 24 2,000;

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- 1 (5) the service plan requires that police and fire
- 2 protection at a level consistent with protection provided within
- 3 the municipality must be provided to the area within 10 days after
- 4 the effective date of the annexation; and
- 5 (6) the municipality and the affected landowners have
- 6 not entered an agreement to not annex the area for a certain time
- 7 period.
- 8 <u>(c) A general-law municipality may annex an area adjacent to</u>
- 9 the municipality without the consent of any of the residents or
- 10 voters of the area and without the consent of any of the owners of
- 11 land in the area if:
- 12 (1) the area is owned by a governmental entity;
- (2) each property in the area is adjacent to property
- in the boundaries of the municipality that is owned by the same
- person as the person who owns the property in the area; or
- 16 (3) one or more municipalities surround more than 65
- 17 percent of the perimeter of the area.
- 18 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
