8	PERSONS. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this
9	subchapter, a person may not be required to complete the range
10	instruction portion of a handgun proficiency course to obtain or
11	renew a concealed handgun license issued under this subchapter if
12	the person:
13	(1) is currently serving in or is honorably discharged
14	<u>from:</u>
15	(A) the army, navy, air force, coast guard, or
16	marine corps of the United States or an auxiliary service or reserve
17	unit of one of those branches of the armed forces; or
18	(B) the state military forces, as defined by
19	Section 431.001; and
20	(2) has, within the five years preceding the date of
21	the person's application for an original or renewed license, as
22	applicable, completed a course of training in handgun proficiency
23	or familiarization as part of the person's service with the armed
24	forces or state military forces.

1	(b) The director by rule shall adopt a procedure by which a
2	license holder who is exempt under Subsection (a) from the range
3	instruction portion of the handgun proficiency requirement may
4	submit a form demonstrating the license holder's qualification for
5	an exemption under that subsection. The form must provide
6	sufficient information to allow the department to verify whether
7	the license holder qualifies for the exemption.
8	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
