16	(D) does not arise out of the ownership,
17	maintenance, or use of a motor vehicle, aircraft, or water vehicle,
18	unless the conduct is intended to cause personal injury or death or
19	the conduct is in violation of Section 545.157 or 545.401,
20	Transportation Code, and results in bodily injury or death, or is in
21	violation of Section 550.021, Transportation Code, or one or more
22	of the following sections of the Penal Code:
