- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 84.007(e), Civil Practice and Remedies
- 6 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 (e) Sections 84.005 and 84.006 of this chapter do not apply
- 8 to a health care provider as defined in <u>Section 74.001</u> [the <u>Medical</u>
- 9 Liability and Insurance Improvement Act of Texas (Article 4590i,
- 10 Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes), unless the provider is a federally
- 11 funded migrant or community health center under the Public Health
- 12 Service Act (42 U.S.C.A. Sections $\underline{254b}$ [$\underline{254(b)}$] and $\underline{254c}$ [$\underline{(c)}$]) or
- is a nonprofit health maintenance organization created and operated
- 14 by a community center under Section 534.101, Health and Safety
- 15 Code, or unless the provider usually provides discounted services
- 16 at or below costs based on the ability of the beneficiary to pay.
- 17 Acceptance of Medicare or Medicaid payments will not disqualify a
- 18 health care provider under this section. In no event shall Sections
- 19 84.005 and 84.006 of this chapter apply to a general hospital or
- 20 special hospital as defined in Chapter 241, Health and Safety Code,
- 21 or a facility or institution licensed under Subtitle C, Title 7,
- 22 Health and Safety Code, or Chapter 242, Health and Safety Code, or
- 23 to any health maintenance organization created and operating under
- 24 Chapter 843, Insurance Code, except for a nonprofit health

- 3 SECTION 2. This Act applies only to a cause of action that
- 4 accrues on or after the effective date of this Act. An action that
- 5 accrued before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law
- 6 applicable to the action immediately before the effective date of
- 7 this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
