12	including Chapters 404 and 2256; and

14	(A) a public retirement system as defined by
15	Section 802.001 that provides service retirement, disability
16	retirement, or death benefits for officers or employees of the
17	<pre>state;</pre>
18	(B) an institution of higher education as defined
19	by Section 61.003, Education Code; or
20	(C) another entity that is part of state
21	government and that manages or invests state funds or for which
22	state funds are managed or invested.
23	(b) This chapter applies in connection with the management

1 held in the state treasury. 2 (c) This chapter does not apply to the extent that an 3 investment standard prescribed by the Texas Constitution prohibits 4 the legislature from restricting the investment of a fund or the investment discretion of an entity responsible for the management 5 6 or investment of a fund. Sec. 2264.002. PROHIBITION ON INVESTMENT IN SUDAN. State 7 funds may not be invested in equities or obligations of a private 8 9 corporation or other private business entity doing business in the Democratic Republic of Sudan. 10 11 SECTION 2. Chapter 2264, Government Code, as added by this Act, applies only to an investment made by or for a state 12 governmental entity on or after the effective date of this Act. 13 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005. 14
