A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to hours of sale for certain alcoholic beverages in 3 certain areas.

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 105.03(c) and (d), Alcoholic Beverage 6 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (c) In a city or county having a population of 800,000
- 8 [500,000] or more, according to the last preceding federal census,
- 9 or 500,000 or more, according to the 22nd Decennial Census of the
- 10 United States, as released by the Bureau of the Census on March 12,
- 11 2001, a holder of a mixed beverage late hours permit may also sell
- 12 and offer for sale mixed beverages between midnight and 2 a.m. on
- 13 any day.
- 14 (d) In a city or county having a population of less than
- 15 800,000 [500,000], according to the last preceding federal census,
- or less than 500,000, according to the 22nd Decennial Census of the
- 17 United States, as released by the Bureau of the Census on March 12,
- 18 <u>2001</u>, the extended hours prescribed in Subsection (c) of this
- 19 section are effective for the sale of mixed beverages and the offer
- 20 to sell them by a holder of a mixed beverages late hours permit:
- 21 (1) in the unincorporated areas of the county if the
- 22 extended hours are adopted by an order of the commissioners court;
- 23 and
- 24 (2) in an incorporated city or town if the extended

- 1 hours are adopted by an ordinance of the governing body of the city
- 2 or town.
- 3 SECTION 2. Sections 105.05(c) and (d), Alcoholic Beverage
- 4 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 5 (c) In a city or county having a population of 800,000
- 6 [500,000] or more, according to the last preceding federal census,
- 7 or 500,000 or more, according to the 22nd Decennial Census of the
- 8 United States, as released by the Bureau of the Census on March 12,
- 9 2001, a holder of a retail dealer's on-premise late hours license
- 10 may also sell, offer for sale, and deliver beer between midnight and
- 11 2 a.m. on any day.
- 12 (d) In a city or county having a population of less than
- 13 800,000 [500,000], according to the last preceding federal census,
- or less than 500,000, according to the 22nd Decennial Census of the
- 15 United States, as released by the Bureau of the Census on March 12,
- 16 2001, the extended hours prescribed in Subsection (c) of this
- 17 section, or any part of the extended hours prescribed in Subsection
- 18 (c) of this section are effective for the sale, offer to sell, and
- 19 delivery of beer by a holder of a retail dealer's on-premise late
- 20 hours license:
- 21 (1) in the unincorporated areas of the county if the
- 22 extended hours are adopted by an order of the commissioners court;
- 23 and
- 24 (2) in an incorporated city or town if the extended
- 25 hours are adopted by an ordinance of the governing body of the city
- 26 or town.
- 27 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to

- 1 the sale of or offer to sell an alcoholic beverage on or after the
- 2 effective date of this Act. The sale of or offer to sell an
- 3 alcoholic beverage before the effective date of this Act is
- 4 governed by the law in effect immediately before that date, and that
- 5 law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
