## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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	AN ACT

- 2 relating to certain requirements concerning the filling of a
- 3 prescription.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 562, Occupations Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 562.003 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 562.003. DISCLOSURE OF PRICE; PATIENT'S OPTION. If
- 8 the price of a drug to a patient is lower than the amount of the
- 9 patient's copayment under the patient's prescription drug insurance
- 10 plan, the pharmacist shall offer the patient the option of paying
- 11 for the drug at the lower price instead of paying the amount of the
- 12 copayment.
- SECTION 2. Section 562.009(a), Occupations Code, is amended
- 14 to read as follows:
- 15 (a) Before delivery of a prescription for a generically
- 16 equivalent drug, a [A] pharmacist must [who selects a generically
- 17 equivalent drug as authorized by this subchapter shall:
- 18  $\left[\frac{(1)}{(1)}\right]$  personally, or through the pharmacist's agent or
- 19 employee:
- 20 (1) [, and before delivery of a generically equivalent
- 21 drug] inform the patient or the patient's agent that a less
- 22 expensive generically equivalent drug is available [has been
- 23 <u>substituted</u>] for the brand prescribed; and
- 24 (2) ask [that] the patient or the patient's agent to

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choose between the generically equivalent drug and the brand 1 prescribed. [is entitled to refuse that substitution; or 2 3 [(2) display, in a prominent place that is in clear 4 public view where prescription drugs are dispensed, a sign in block letters not less than one inch in height that reads, in both English 5 6 and Spanish: ["TEXAS LAW ALLOWS A LESS EXPENSIVE GENERICALLY 7 EQUIVALENT DRUC TO BE SUBSTITUTED FOR CERTAIN BRAND 8 NAME DRUGS UNLESS YOUR PHYSICIAN DIRECTS OTHERWISE. 9 YOU HAVE A RIGHT TO REFUSE SUCH SUBSTITUTION. CONSULT 10 11 YOUR PHYSICIAN OR PHARMACIST CONCERNING THE AVAILABILITY OF A SAFE, LESS EXPENSIVE DRUG FOR YOUR 12 <u>USE."</u>] 13 SECTION 3. Section 562.009(b), Occupations Code, 14 repealed. 15 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005. 16
