DISCLOSURE OF PRICE; PATIENT'S OPTION. 7 the price of a drug to a patient is lower than the amount of the 8 9 patient's copayment under the patient's prescription drug insurance plan, the pharmacist shall offer the patient the option of paying 10 11 for the drug at the lower price instead of paying the amount of the 12 copayment. SECTION 2. 14	SECTION 3. Section 562.009, Occupations Code, is amended by
15	adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
16	(a-1) In addition to the requirements of Subsection (a), a
17	pharmacist must display, in a prominent place that is in clear
18	public view where prescription drugs are dispensed, a sign in block
19	letters not less than one inch in height that reads, in both English
20	and Spanish:
21	"TEXAS LAW REQUIRES A PHARMACIST TO INFORM YOU IF
22	A LESS EXPENSIVE GENERICALLY EQUIVALENT DRUG IS
23	AVAILABLE FOR CERTAIN BRAND NAME DRUGS AND TO ASK YOU
24	TO CHOOSE BETWEEN THE GENERIC AND THE BRAND NAME DRUG.
25	YOU HAVE A RIGHT TO ACCEPT OR REFUSE THE GENERICALLY
26	EQUIVALENT DRUG."

SECTION 4. Section 562.009(b), Occupations Code, is amended

- 1 to read as follows:
- 2 (b) A pharmacy is not required to comply with the provisions
- 3 of Subsection (a):
- 4 (1) in the case of the refill of a prescription for
- 5 which the pharmacy previously complied with Subsection (a) with
- 6 respect to the same patient or patient's agent; or
- 7 (2) if the patient's physician or physician's agent
- 8 advises the pharmacy that:
- 9 (A) the physician has informed the patient or the
- 10 patient's agent that a less expensive generically equivalent drug
- is available for the brand prescribed; and
- 12 (B) the patient or the patient's agent has chosen
- 13 either the brand prescribed or the less expensive generically
- 14 equivalent drug. [To comply with Subsection (a)(2), only one sign
- 15 <u>is required to be displayed in a pharmacy.</u>]
- 16 SECTION 5. Section 562.009, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 17 adding Subsections (c) and (d) to read as follows:
- 18 (c) A pharmacy that supplies a prescription by mail is
- 19 considered to have complied with the provisions of Subsection (a)
- 20 if the pharmacy includes on the prescription order form completed
- 21 by the patient or the patient's agent language that clearly and
- 22 conspicuously:
- 23 (1) states that if a less expensive generically
- 24 equivalent drug is available for the brand prescribed, the patient
- 25 or the patient's agent may choose between the generically
- 26 equivalent drug and the brand prescribed; and
- 27 (2) allows the patient or the patient's agent to

- 1 indicate the choice of the generically equivalent drug or the brand
- 2 prescribed.
- 3 (d) If the patient or the patient's agent fails to indicate
- 4 otherwise to a pharmacy on the prescription order form under
- 5 Subsection (c), the pharmacy may dispense a generically equivalent
- 6 drug.
- 7 SECTION 6. (a) The Texas State Board of Pharmacy shall
- 8 prescribe and distribute the sign required by Section 562.009(a-1),
- 9 Occupations Code, as added by this Act. A pharmacist is not
- 10 required to display the sign until the pharmacist receives the sign
- 11 from the Texas State Board of Pharmacy.
- 12 (b) Not later than January 1, 2006, a pharmacy that supplies
- 13 a prescription by mail must comply with the provisions of Section
- 14 562.009(c), Occupations Code, as added by this Act, for each
- 15 prescription that the pharmacy supplies by mail.
- SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
