The change in law made by this Act in adding Article 59.01(2)(E), Code of Criminal Procedure, applies only to the forfeiture of contraband used to facilitate or intended to be used to facilitate the commission of an offense under Section 15.031 or 43.25, Penal Code, committed on or after the effective date of this Act. Forfeiture of contraband used to facilitate or intended to be used to facilitate the commission of an offense under Section 15.031 or 43.25, Penal Code, committed before the effective date of this Act is covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
