2 SECTION 2. The General Land Office may transfer any money 3 the land office for contributed to the 4 Adopt-A-Map/Adopt-A-Document program under Section 31.0655, Natural Resources Code, to the Save Texas History and Adopt-A-Beach 5 6 programs under Section 31.0655, Natural Resources Code, as amended by this Act. 7

8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
