- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 42.042(c), Human Resources Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (c) The department shall provide a standard procedure for
- 9 receiving and recording complaints. The executive commissioner
- 10 shall adopt rules regarding the receipt of anonymous complaints
- 11 made regarding child-care facilities and family homes to limit the
- 12 number of anonymous complaints investigated by the department.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 42, Human Resources Code,
- 14 is amended by adding Sections 42.0446 and 42.0447 to read as
- 15 follows:
- 16 Sec. 42.0446. REMOVAL OF CERTAIN INVESTIGATION INFORMATION
- 17 FROM RECORDS. The executive commissioner shall adopt rules
- 18 providing a procedure by which the department removes from the
- 19 department's records with respect to a child-care facility or
- 20 registered family home information relating to a complaint alleging
- 21 that the facility or family home failed to comply with the
- 22 <u>department's minimum standards if, at the conclusion of an</u>
- 23 investigation, the department determines that the complaint is
- 24 false or lacks factual foundation.

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- Sec. 42.0447. FALSE REPORT; CRIMINAL PENALTY. (a) A

  person commits an offense if the person knowingly or intentionally

  files a complaint alleging that a child-care facility or registered

  family home failed to comply with the department's minimum

  standards and the person knows the allegation is false or lacks
- 7 (b) An offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor
  8 unless it is shown on the trial of the offense that the person has
  9 previously been convicted under this section, in which case the
  10 offense is a state jail felony.

- SECTION 3. Section 42.0446, Human Resources Code, as added by this Act, applies to a complaint under Chapter 42, Human Resources Code, with respect to a child-care facility or registered family home that is pending on or filed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
