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## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to including certain bailiffs in the definition of peace 3 officer. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, as 5 6 amended by Chapters 235, 474, and 930, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular Session, 2003, is reenacted and amended to read as follows: 7 Art. 2.12. WHO ARE PEACE OFFICERS. The following are peace 8 officers: 9 (1) sheriffs, their deputies, 10 and those reserve 11 deputies who hold a permanent peace officer license issued under 12 Chapter 1701, Occupations Code; 13 (2) constables, deputy constables, and those reserve 14 deputy constables who hold a permanent peace officer license issued 15 under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code; (3) marshals or police officers of an incorporated 16 city, town, or village, and those reserve municipal police officers 17 18 who hold a permanent peace officer license issued under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code; 19 rangers and officers commissioned by the Public (4) 20 21 Safety Commission and the Director of the Department of Public 22 Safety; investigators of the district attorneys', criminal 23 (5) 24 district attorneys', and county attorneys' offices;

16 (34) officers commissioned by the State Board of 17 Dental Examiners under Section 254.013, Occupations Code, subject 18 to the limitations imposed by that section; and

19 (35) a bailiff serving a grand jury or district court 20 under Article 19.36 or 36.24 of this code; Section 201.008, Family 21 Code; or Chapter 24, 53, or 62, Government Code.

22 SECTION 2. Section 53.0071, Government Code, is amended to 23 read as follows:

Sec. 53.0071. BAILIFF AS PEACE OFFICER. <u>A</u> [Unless the
appointing judge provides otherwise in the order of appointment, a]
bailiff appointed under <u>this chapter</u> [Section 53.001(b) or (g) or
53.002(c), (e), or (f)] is a "peace officer" for purposes of Article

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2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure.
 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
