A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	relating to a pilot program to provide health services to state
3	employees in state office complexes.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 6, Government Code, is amended
6	by adding Chapter 671 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 671. HEALTH SERVICES IN STATE OFFICE COMPLEXES
8	Sec. 671.001. NURSE PRACTITIONER IN STATE OFFICE COMPLEXES;
9	PILOT PROGRAM. (a) To reduce the cost of health care and increase
10	the wellness and productivity of state employees, the Employees
11	Retirement System of Texas shall develop and implement a pilot
12	program to make available a licensed advanced practice nurse to
13	provide authorized on-site health services at a selected location
14	to state employees who choose to make use of the services.
15	(b) The pilot program must provide for the following:
16	(1) a licensed advanced practice nurse as defined by
17	Section 301.152, Occupations Code, who is employed by the state or
18	whose services are acquired by contract, who will be located at a
19	<pre>state office complex;</pre>
20	(2) a licensed physician, who is employed by a state
21	governmental entity for purposes other than the pilot program or
22	whose services are acquired by contract, who will perform all
23	supervisory functions described by Section 157.052(e), Occupations
24	<u>Code;</u>

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Employees Retirement System of Texas shall begin the pilot program 1 2 at the headquarters of the Texas Commission on Environmental 3 Quality, located on the Park 35 Campus in Austin, Texas.

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4 (c) Not later than December 31, 2006, the Employees Retirement System of Texas shall issue a report containing a 5 6 summary of employee participation rates, a costs and benefits analysis, and legislative recommendations concerning the future of 7 8 the pilot program established under Chapter 671, Government Code, 9 as added by this Act, to the:

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(1) governor;

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lieutenant governor; (2)

speaker of the house of representatives; 12 (3)

standing committees of the senate and house of 13 (4) representatives having jurisdiction over state spending issues; 14 15 and

16 (5) standing committees of the senate and house of 17 representatives having jurisdiction over health or human services 18 issues.

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.

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
