## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to a pilot program to provide health services to state 3 employees in state office complexes. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 6, Government Code, is amended 5 6 by adding Chapter 671 to read as follows: CHAPTER 671. HEALTH SERVICES IN STATE OFFICE COMPLEXES 7 Sec. 671.001. NURSE PRACTITIONER IN STATE OFFICE COMPLEXES; 8 PILOT PROGRAM. (a) To reduce the cost of health care and increase 9 the wellness and productivity of state employees, the Employees 10 Retirement System of Texas shall develop and implement a pilot 11 12 program to make available a licensed advanced practice nurse to provide authorized on-site health services at a selected location 13 14 to state employees who choose to make use of the services. (b) The pilot program must provide for the following: 15 (1) a licensed advanced practice nurse as defined by 16 Section 301.152, Occupations Code, who is employed by the state or 17 18 whose services are acquired by contract, who will be located at a state office complex; 19 (2) a licensed physician, who is employed by a state 20 21 governmental entity for purposes other than the pilot program or whose services are acquired by contract, who will perform all 22 supervisory functions described by Section 157.052(e), Occupations 23 24 Code;

No. 952 (3) appropriate office space and equipment for the 1 2 advanced practice nurse to provide basic medical care to employees at the state office complex where the nurse is located; and 3 4 (4) professional liability insurance covering 5 services provided by the advanced practice nurse. 6 (c) The board of trustees of the Employees Retirement System of Texas shall adopt rules necessary for implementation of this 7 section and shall seek the assistance of state agencies as 8 9 necessary for the implementation of this chapter. The Employees Retirement System of Texas shall 10 (d) determine whether it is more efficient to pay directly for some or 11 all of the expenses associated with implementing this chapter or to 12 reimburse expenses through an interagency agreement as the expenses 13 are incurred by an agency participating in the program. 14 15 (e) The Employees Retirement System of Texas may order the 16 pilot program continued or expanded to cover more state office 17 complexes on finding: 18 (1) the pilot program has proven beneficial in meeting 19 the health care needs of state employees; and 20 (2) continuation or expansion of the pilot program is 21 economically beneficial. 22 SECTION 2. (a) As soon as possible after the effective date of this Act, the board of trustees of the Employees Retirement 23 24 System of Texas shall adopt rules as required by Section 671.001, 25 Government Code, as added by this Act. (b) Not later than the 90th day after the date rules are 26 adopted in accordance with Subsection (a) of this section, the 27

Employees Retirement System of Texas shall begin the pilot program 1 2 at the headquarters of the Texas Commission on Environmental 3 Quality, located on the Park 35 Campus in Austin, Texas.

4 (c) Not later than December 31, 2006, the Employees Retirement System of Texas shall issue a report containing a 5 6 summary of employee participation rates, a costs and benefits analysis, and legislative recommendations concerning the future of 7 8 the pilot program established under Chapter 671, Government Code, 9 as added by this Act, to the:

(1) governor;

lieutenant governor; (2)

speaker of the house of representatives; 12 (3)

standing committees of the senate and house of 13 (4) representatives having jurisdiction over state spending issues; 14 15 and

standing committees of the senate and house of 16 (5) 17 representatives having jurisdiction over health or human services 18 issues.
