5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 551, Government Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 551.0726 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 551.0726. TEXAS BUILDING AND PROCUREMENT COMMISSION:
9	DELIBERATION REGARDING CONTRACT BEING NEGOTIATED; CLOSED MEETING.
10	(a) The Texas Building and Procurement Commission may conduct a
11	closed meeting to deliberate business and financial issues relating
12	to a contract being negotiated if, before conducting the closed
13	meeting:
14	(1) the commission votes unanimously that
15	deliberation in an open meeting would have a detrimental effect on
16	the position of the state in negotiations with a third person; and
17	(2) the attorney advising the commission issues a
18	written determination that deliberation in an open meeting would
19	have a detrimental effect on the position of the state in
20	negotiations with a third person.
21	(b) Notwithstanding Section 551.103(a), the commission must
22	make a tape recording of the proceedings of a closed meeting held
23	under this section.
24	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
