- 2 relating to the proximity of the residences of certain sex 3 offenders or sexually violent predators to public schools.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 38, Education Code, is 6 amended by adding Section 38.024 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 38.024. CERTAIN PERSONS PROHIBITED FROM RESIDING NEAR
- 8 SCHOOL. (a) This section applies only to a person who is:
- 10 Chapter 62, Code of Criminal Procedure, because of a reportable

- 11 conviction or adjudication involving a victim younger than 17 years
- of age; or

- (2) civilly committed as a sexually violent predator
- 14 under Chapter 841, Health and Safety Code, and subject to
- outpatient treatment and supervision under that chapter.
- 16 (b) A person to whom this section applies may not reside
- 17 <u>within 1,000 feet of a public school campus, as measured in a</u>
- 18 straight line from the nearest property line of the residence to the
- 19 nearest property line of the campus.
- 20 (c) A person to whom this section applies who resides within
- 21 1,000 feet of a school campus may remain at the person's residence
- 22 if:
- 23 (1) the person resided at the residence on September
- 24 1, 2005; or

- 1 (2) the person is residing at the residence at the time 2 that the campus is established or extended to within 1,000 feet of
- 3 the residence.
- (d) For each person described by Subsection (c) who remains
- 5 at the residence, the state, county, or local law enforcement
- 6 agency with the primary responsibility of registering or
- 7 supervising the person shall provide written notice, including the
- 8 person's address and a recent photograph of the person, to the
- 9 appropriate public school campus not later than the first day of
- 10 <u>instruction each school year</u>.
- 11 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
