A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT	

- 2 relating to reducing certain burdens imposed on classroom teachers
- 3 and other school district employees.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 7, Education Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 7.060 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 7.060. REDUCING PAPERWORK. (a) The commissioner
- 8 shall annually review and, to the greatest extent practicable,
- 9 reduce written reports and other paperwork required of a school
- 10 district by the agency.
- 11 (b) The commissioner shall adopt a policy that limits
- 12 written reports and other paperwork that a principal or classroom
- 13 teacher may be required to complete.
- 14 SECTION 2. Subchapter I, Chapter 21, Education Code, is
- amended by adding Section 21.4011 to read as follows:
- Sec. 21.4011. MAXIMUM WORKDAY; MEETINGS. (a) A workday for
- 17 <u>a classroom teacher may not be more than 30 minutes longer than the</u>
- 18 <u>instructional day.</u>
- 19 (b) Except in the case of an emergency, a classroom teacher
- 20 <u>must be given at least 24 hours' notice of any meeting that is held</u>
- 21 outside of the teacher's regular workday as provided under
- 22 Subsection (a). The commissioner by rule shall define an emergency
- 23 for purposes of this subsection.
- (c) Notwithstanding any other provision of this code, a

- 1 classroom teacher may not be required to attend more than one
- 2 meeting each week that is held outside of the teacher's regular
- 3 workday as provided under Subsection (a).
- 4 SECTION 3. Section 21.404, Education Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 21.404. PLANNING AND PREPARATION TIME. (a) Each
- 7 classroom teacher is entitled to at least 450 minutes within each
- 8 two-week period for instructional preparation, including
- 9 parent-teacher conferences, evaluating students' work, and
- 10 planning. A planning and preparation period under this section may
- 11 not be less than 45 minutes within the instructional day. During a
- 12 planning and preparation period, a classroom teacher may not be
- 13 required to participate in any other activity.
- 14 (b) Each school district shall schedule at least one
- 15 <u>two-hour period each month during the regular workday for teachers</u>
- 16 to plan and collaborate with other teachers who teach the same
- 17 subject or grade level.
- 18 (c) To allow teachers additional preparation and planning
- 19 time, each school district and school shall establish a volunteer
- 20 program under which volunteers perform most routine nonteaching
- 21 <u>duties, including performing clerical duties, monitoring students</u>
- 22 in the cafeteria, and performing routine before-school and
- 23 <u>after-school duties such as monitoring students at bus stops.</u>
- SECTION 4. Section 39.075(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 25 read as follows:
- 26 (a) The commissioner shall authorize special accreditation
- 27 investigations to be conducted:

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- 1 (1) when excessive numbers of absences of students
- 2 eligible to be tested on state assessment instruments are
- 3 determined;
- 4 (2) when excessive numbers of allowable exemptions
- from the required state assessment are determined;
- 6 (3) in response to complaints submitted to the agency
- 7 with respect to alleged violations of civil rights or other
- 8 requirements imposed on the state by federal law or court order;
- 9 (4) in response to established compliance reviews of
- 10 the district's financial accounting practices and state and federal
- 11 program requirements;
- 12 (5) when extraordinary numbers of student placements
- 13 in alternative education programs, other than placements under
- 14 Sections 37.006 and 37.007, are determined;
- 15 (6) in response to an allegation involving a conflict
- 16 between members of the board of trustees or between the board and
- 17 the district administration if it appears that the conflict
- involves a violation of a role or duty of the board members or the
- 19 administration clearly defined by this code;
- 20 (7) when excessive numbers of students in special
- 21 education programs under Subchapter A, Chapter 29, are assessed
- 22 through assessment instruments developed or adopted under Section
- 23 39.023(b); [or]
- 24 (8) in response to a complaint submitted to the agency
- 25 concerning imposition of excessive paperwork requirements on
- 26 classroom teachers; or
- 27 (9) as the commissioner otherwise determines

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- 1 necessary.
- 2 SECTION 5. Sections 2-4 of this Act apply beginning with the
- 3 2005-2006 school year.
- 4 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
