A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the regulation of certain fire protection sprinkler
- 3 system journeymen and apprentices.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 1, Article 5.43-3, Insurance Code, is
- 6 amended by amending Subdivisions (11) and (12) and adding
- 7 Subdivisions (15) and (16) to read as follows:
- 8 (11) "Certificate of registration" means the document
- 9 issued to:
- 10 (A) a fire protection sprinkler system
- 11 contractor authorizing the contractor [same] to conduct business in
- 12 this state; or
- 13 (B) an apprentice authorizing the apprentice to
- 14 install, alter, maintain, service, or inspect fire protection
- 15 sprinkler systems as an employee of a fire protection sprinkler
- 16 system contractor.
- 17 (12) "License" means the document issued to a
- 18 responsible managing employee or a fire protection sprinkler system
- 19 contractor employee authorizing that employee [same] to engage in
- 20 the fire protection sprinkler system business in this state.
- 21 (15) "Fire protection sprinkler system apprentice"
- 22 means a person who:
- (A) installs, alters, maintains, services, or
- 24 inspects a fire protection sprinkler system or any part of the

- 1 system as an employee of a fire protection sprinkler system
- 2 contractor; and
- 3 (B) has less than 8,000 hours of experience as an
- 4 employee of a contractor.
- 5 (16) "Fire protection sprinkler system journeyman"
- 6 means a person who:
- 7 (A) installs, alters, maintains, services, or
- 8 inspects a fire protection sprinkler system or any part of the
- 9 system as an employee of a fire protection sprinkler system
- 10 contractor; and
- 11 (B) has at least 8,000 hours of experience as an
- 12 employee of a contractor.
- SECTION 2. Section 3(a), Article 5.43-3, Insurance Code, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- 15 (a) The board shall administer this article and may issue
- 16 rules necessary to its administration through the State Fire
- 17 Marshal. Under rules adopted under this subsection, the board
- 18 shall operate [may create] a specialized licensing or registration
- 19 program for fire protection sprinkler system contractors and for
- journeymen and apprentices of those contractors.
- 21 SECTION 3. Section 4, Article 5.43-3, Insurance Code, is
- 22 amended by adding Subsections (c-1), (c-2), and (d-1) and amending
- 23 Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 24 (c-1) Each employee of a fire protection sprinkler system
- 25 <u>contractor who installs, alters, maintains, services, or inspects a</u>
- 26 fire protection sprinkler system and who has at least 8,000 hours of
- 27 documented experience as a fire protection sprinkler system

- 1 employee or apprentice shall obtain a journeyman license. The
- 2 board shall issue the license conditioned on the successful
- 3 completion of the examination requirement and other requirements
- 4 prescribed by the rules adopted under this article. Each applicant
- 5 for a journeyman license must submit with the application a
- 6 nonrefundable examination fee in an amount not to exceed \$30.
- 7 (c-2) Each employee of a fire protection sprinkler system
- 8 contractor who installs, alters, maintains, services, or inspects
- 9 <u>fire protection sprinkler systems and who has less than 8,000 hours</u>
- 10 of experience as an employee of a fire protection sprinkler system
- 11 contractor must register with the board as an apprentice. To be
- 12 eligible for registration, the applicant must:
- 13 (1) be enrolled in an apprenticeship program certified
- 14 by this state or the United States;
- 15 (2) meet other requirements prescribed by the rules
- 16 <u>adopted under this article; and</u>
- 17 (3) submit a nonrefundable registration fee in an
- 18 amount not to exceed \$15.
- (d) An initial contractor [A] certificate of registration
- 20 and an initial managing employee [a] license are valid for a period
- 21 of one year from the date of $\underline{issuance}$ [\underline{issue}] and are renewable
- 22 [$\frac{\text{annually}}{\text{annual}}$] on payment of the $\frac{\text{renewal}}{\text{emend}}$ [$\frac{\text{annual}}{\text{annual}}$] fee[$\frac{\text{renewal}}{\text{annual}}$]
- 23 however, that the initial certificates of registration or licenses
- 24 issued on or after September 1, 1983, may be issued for periods of
- 25 less than one year and the annual fee shall be prorated
- 26 proportionally].
- 27 (d-1) A journeyman license and an apprentice certificate of

- 1 registration are valid for one year from the date of issuance and
- 2 are renewable on the anniversary of the date of issuance on payment
- 3 of the applicable renewal fee. The renewal fee for a journeyman
- 4 license is \$30. The renewal fee for an apprentice certificate of
- 5 registration is \$15.
- 6 SECTION 4. Sections 5(a) and (c), Article 5.43-3, Insurance
- 7 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) The board shall not issue a contractor certificate of
- 9 registration under this article unless the applicant files with the
- 10 board evidence of a general liability insurance policy that
- includes products and completed operations coverage. The limits of
- 12 insurance coverage required by this section shall be in an amount
- 13 not less than \$100,000 combined single limits for bodily injury and
- 14 property damage for each occurrence and not less than \$300,000
- 15 aggregate for all occurrences per policy year, unless the board
- increases or decreases the amounts under Section 7 of this article.
- 17 The policy shall be conditioned to pay on behalf of the insured
- 18 those amounts that the insured is legally obligated to pay as
- 19 damages because of bodily injury and property damage caused by an
- 20 occurrence involving the insured or the insured's servant, officer,
- 21 agent, or employee in the conduct of any business registered under
- 22 this article.
- (c) Failure to maintain liability insurance required under
- 24 this section constitutes grounds for the denial, suspension, or
- 25 revocation of a contractor certificate of registration issued under
- 26 this article after notice and opportunity for hearing.
- SECTION 5. Section 5A(a), Article 5.43-3, Insurance Code,

- 1 is amended to read as follows:
- 2 (a) Each renewal of a license or certificate of registration
- 3 issued under this article is valid for a period of one year [two
- 4 years]. The managing employee license fee or contractor
- 5 registration fee [for each year of the two-year period] is payable
- 6 on renewal.
- 7 SECTION 6. Section 5B, Article 5.43-3, Insurance Code, is
- 8 amended by adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:
- 9 (f) A person who fails the examination for a fire protection
- 10 <u>sprinkler system journeyman license may not retake the examination</u>
- 11 before the 90th day after the date of the initial examination.
- 12 SECTION 7. Section 5C, Article 5.43-3, Insurance Code, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 5C. CONTINUING EDUCATION. (a) Except as provided by
- 15 <u>Subsection</u> (b) of this section, the [The] board may adopt
- 16 procedures for certifying and may certify continuing education
- 17 programs. Participation in the programs is voluntary.
- 18 (b) The board shall adopt procedures for certifying and
- 19 shall certify continuing education programs for fire protection
- 20 sprinkler system journeymen. A journeyman or an apprentice must
- 21 successfully complete six hours of continuing education courses on
- the laws and codes governing fire protection sprinkler systems to
- 23 <u>be eligible to renew a license or certificate of registration under</u>
- this article.
- 25 (c) The board annually shall approve individuals, business
- 26 entities, or associations to provide continuing education courses.
- 27 A course provider must offer classroom and correspondence

- 1 instruction for each course offered as part of a continuing
- 2 education program for renewal of a license or certificate of
- 3 <u>registration under this chapter.</u>
- 4 (d) The board shall periodically publish a list of approved
- 5 subjects for continuing education courses.
- 6 (e) A course provider shall:
- 7 <u>(1) provide a uniquely numbered certificate of</u>
- 8 completion to a license or certificate holder only on completion of
- 9 a continuing education course by the person; and
- 10 (2) notify the board, in an electronic format approved
- 11 by the board, of a license or certificate holder's completion of a
- 12 course within 48 hours of the time of completion.
- 13 (f) The board shall annually review the operation of each
- 14 course provider to ensure that continuing education programs are
- 15 provided equitably across this state.
- SECTION 8. Section 8, Article 5.43-3, Insurance Code, is
- 17 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 8. PROHIBITED ACTS. A person or organization may not:
- 19 (1) plan, sell, install, maintain, or service a fire
- 20 protection sprinkler system without a valid certificate of
- 21 registration as a fire protection sprinkler system contractor;
- 22 (2) act as a fire protection sprinkler system
- 23 contractor under a certificate of registration without having at
- least one full-time employee who holds a valid responsible managing
- employee license; provided, however, that a person or organization
- 26 with a current certificate of registration may act as a fire
- 27 protection sprinkler system contractor for 30 days after the death

- 1 or dissociation of its licensed responsible managing employee or
- 2 for such longer period as may be approved by the board pursuant to
- 3 the rules adopted hereunder;
- 4 (3) act as a responsible managing employee,
- 5 journeyman, or apprentice for a fire protection sprinkler system
- 6 contractor without a valid license or certificate of registration,
- 7 as applicable;
- 8 (4) obtain or attempt to obtain a certificate of
- 9 registration or license by fraudulent representation; [or]
- 10 (5) plan, sell, install, maintain, or service a fire
- 11 protection sprinkler system in violation of this article or the
- 12 rules adopted under this article;
- 13 <u>(6) refuse to display a license or certificate of</u>
- 14 registration on request or fail to carry the license or certificate
- of registration while engaged in an activity regulated under this
- 16 <u>article; or</u>
- 17 (7) enter into an agreement for the use of the person's
- 18 license or certificate of registration with another person who is
- 19 violating this article or is found to have violated this article or
- 20 whose license or certificate is currently suspended or has been
- 21 revoked in the preceding year.
- SECTION 9. Article 5.43-3, Insurance Code, is amended by
- 23 adding Section 10A to read as follows:
- Sec. 10A. CIVIL PENALTY. (a) A person who violates Section 8
- of this article is liable for a civil penalty in an amount not to
- 26 exceed \$5,000 for each violation. Each day a violation occurs
- 27 constitutes a separate violation.

1	(b)	In	determining	the	amount	of	the	civil	penalty,	the

- 2 court shall consider the seriousness of the violation, including:
- 3 (1) the nature, circumstances, extent, and gravity of a prohibited act;
- 5 (2) the hazard or potential hazard to the health,
 6 safety, or economic welfare of the public created by the violation;
- 7 (3) the economic harm to property or the environment 8 caused by the violation;
- 9 (4) the history of previous violations;
- 10 (5) the amount necessary to deter future violations;
- 11 (6) efforts made to correct the violation; and
- 12 (7) any other matter that justice may require.
- 13 (c) The attorney general or the appropriate district or
 14 county attorney, in the name of the state, may institute and conduct
 15 an action authorized by this section in a district court of Travis
 16 County or of a county in which any part of the violation occurs.
- (d) A penalty collected under this section by the attorney
 general shall be deposited to the credit of the general revenue
 fund. A penalty collected under this section by a district or
 county attorney shall be deposited to the credit of the general fund
- of the county in which the suit was heard.

 SECTION 10. (a) Not later than January 1, 2006

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SECTION 10. (a) Not later than January 1, 2006, the Texas Department of Insurance and the state fire marshal shall adopt rules and establish the procedures and examination requirements necessary to implement the licensing of fire protection sprinkler system journeymen and the registration of fire protection sprinkler system apprentices under Article 5.43-3, Insurance Code, as amended

- 2 (b) A fire protection sprinkler system journeyman is not
- 3 required to hold a license under Article 5.43-3, Insurance Code, as
- 4 amended by this Act, before July 1, 2006.
- 5 (c) A fire protection sprinkler system apprentice is not
- 6 required to register under Article 5.43-3, Insurance Code, as
- 7 amended by this Act, before July 1, 2006.
- 8 (d) A fire protection sprinkler system employee who has at
- 9 least 8,000 hours of experience on the effective date of this Act
- 10 and who applies for a fire protection sprinkler system journeyman
- 11 license within six months of the effective date of this Act is not
- 12 required to pass a license examination under Article 5.43-3,
- 13 Insurance Code, as amended by this Act, to receive a journeyman
- 14 license.
- 15 SECTION 11. (a) The change in law made by Section 10A,
- 16 Article 5.43-3, Insurance Code, as added by this Act applies only to
- 17 conduct occuring on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 18 (b) Conduct occuring before the effective date of this Act
- is covered by the law in effect when the conduct occurred, and the
- 20 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 21 SECTION 12. This Act takes effect immediately if it
- 22 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 23 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 24 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
