## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to notification provided by certain health care
3	professionals to students and parents or guardians of students who
4	participate in extracurricular sports activities sponsored or

6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
7	SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 33, Education Code, is
8	amended by adding Section 33.090 to read as follows:
9	Sec. 33.090. NOTIFICATION BY CERTAIN HEALTH CARE
10	PROFESSIONALS CONCERNING INJURIES RESULTING FROM HEAD TRAUMA. (a)
11	A physician, physician assistant, or nurse practitioner who
12	examines a student to determine the student's physical fitness to
13	participate in a sports activity sponsored or sanctioned by the
14	University Interscholastic League shall provide the student and the
15	student's parent or guardian with written notification, in the form
16	and with the specific content adopted jointly by the agency, the
17	Department of State Health Services, the Texas Traumatic Brain
18	Injury Advisory Council, and the University Interscholastic
19	League, that explains:
20	(1) the risk of secondary injury resulting from head
21	trauma suffered during a sports activity;
22	(2) the types of secondary injury that may occur; and
23	(3) the symptoms of secondary injury.
24	(b) A physician, physician assistant, or nurse practitioner

- 6 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2005-2006
- 7 school year.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
