Section 12.111(a), Education Code, is amended to 6 read as follows: Each charter granted under this subchapter must: 7 (a) (1) describe the educational program to be offered, 8 which must include the required curriculum as provided by Section 9 28.002; 10 specify the period for which the charter or any 11 (2) 12 charter renewal is valid; 13 (3) provide that continuation or renewal of the 14 charter is contingent on acceptable student performance on assessment instruments adopted under Subchapter B, Chapter 39, and 15 on compliance with any accountability provision specified by the 16 charter, by a deadline or at intervals specified by the charter; 17 18 (4) establish the level of student performance that is considered acceptable for purposes of Subdivision (3); 19 specify any basis, in addition to 20 (5) a basis 21 specified by this subchapter, on which the charter may be placed on 22 probation or revoked or on which renewal of the charter may be 23 denied: prohibit discrimination in admission policy on the 24 (6)

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distribute to parents information related to the qualifications of each professional employee of the program, including any professional or educational degree held by each employee, a statement of any certification under Subchapter B, Chapter 21, held by each employee, and any relevant experience of each employee;

6 (11) describe the process by which the person7 providing the program will adopt an annual budget;

8 (12) describe the manner in which an annual audit of 9 the financial and programmatic operations of the program is to be 10 conducted, including the manner in which the person providing the 11 program will provide information necessary for the school district 12 in which the program is located to participate, as required by this 13 code or by State Board of Education rule, in the Public Education 14 Information Management System (PEIMS);

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(13) describe the facilities to be used;

16 (14) describe the geographical area served by the 17 program; and

18 (15) specify any type of enrollment criteria to be 19 used.

20 SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 12, Education Code, is 21 amended by adding Section 12.1171 to read as follows:

22 <u>Sec. 12.1171. ADMISSION TO OPEN-ENROLLMENT CHARTER SCHOOLS</u>
23 <u>SPECIALIZING IN PERFORMING ARTS. (a) Notwithstanding Section</u>
24 <u>12.117, the governing body of an open-enrollment charter school</u>
25 <u>that specializes in one or more performing arts may:</u>

26 (1) require an applicant to audition for admission to 27 the school or advancement to the next grade level; and

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1 (2) if the number of applicants who perform 2 satisfactorily in an audition exceeds the number of available 3 positions in the school at the appropriate grade level, fill the 4 available positions using one lottery for male applicants and one 5 lottery for female applicants so that the number of males admitted 6 and the number of females admitted are equal.

7 (b) In admitting students under this section, an
8 open-enrollment charter school may not discriminate on the basis of
9 a student's national origin, ethnicity, or religion.

SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2005-2006 school year.

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
