- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 24.541(c), Government Code, is amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (c) In addition to other jurisdiction provided by law, the
- 7 396th District Court has concurrent original jurisdiction with  $\underline{\boldsymbol{\cdot}}$
- 8 <u>(1)</u> the county criminal courts in Tarrant County over
- 9 misdemeanor cases; and
- 10 (2) the justice courts to receive guilty pleas in
- 11 misdemeanor cases.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 25.2223(a), Government Code, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 (a) A county criminal court in Tarrant County has
- 15 jurisdiction over all criminal matters and causes, original and
- 16 appellate, prescribed by law for county courts, but does not have
- 17 civil jurisdiction. The County Criminal Court No. 5 of Tarrant
- 18 County also has concurrent original jurisdiction with the justice
- 19 <u>courts to receive guilty pleas in misdemeanor cases.</u> The County
- 20 Criminal Courts Nos. 5 and 10 of Tarrant County also have concurrent
- 21 jurisdiction within the county of all appeals from criminal
- 22 convictions under the laws of this state and the municipal
- ordinances of the municipalities located in Tarrant County that are
- 24 appealed from the justice courts and municipal courts in the

- 1 county. The County Criminal Courts Nos. 5, 7, 8, 9, and 10 of
- 2 Tarrant County also have concurrent jurisdiction with the district
- 3 court in felony cases to conduct arraignments, conduct pretrial
- 4 hearings, and accept guilty pleas.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005
