H.B. No. 1145

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the provision of instruction in the Spanish language as
3 part of the required curriculum in public schools.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 28.002, Education Code, is amended by
6 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (c-2) and (c-3) to
7 read as follows:

8 (a) Each school district that offers kindergarten through
9 grade 12 shall offer, as a required curriculum:

10 (1) a foundation curriculum that includes:

11 (A) English language arts;

12 (B) Spanish;

13 (C) mathematics;

14 (D) [~~C~~] science; and

15 (E) [~~D~~] social studies, consisting of Texas,

16 United States, and world history, government, and geography; and

17 (2) an enrichment curriculum that includes:

18 (A) to the extent possible, languages other than
19 English and Spanish;

20 (B) health;

21 (C) physical education;

22 (D) fine arts;

23 (E) economics, with emphasis on the free
24 enterprise system and its benefits;

1 (F) career and technology education; and

2 (G) technology applications.

3 (c-2) In adopting the essential knowledge and skills under
4 Subsection (c) for Spanish, the State Board of Education shall
5 adopt knowledge and skills designed to result in students who are
6 proficient in speaking, reading, writing, and comprehending
7 Spanish.

8 (c-3) The State Board of Education may adopt rules providing
9 for an exemption from the required Spanish curriculum for a student
10 who demonstrates proficiency in speaking, reading, writing, and
11 comprehending Spanish.

12 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2006-2007
13 school year.

14 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
18 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
