4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 78, Civil Practice and
6	Remedies Code, is amended to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 78. CERTAIN FIRE FIGHTERS, [AND] FIRE-FIGHTING ENTITIES,
8	AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES PERSONNEL AND PROVIDERS
9	SECTION 2. Chapter 78, Civil Practice and Remedies Code, is
10	amended by adding Subchapter D to read as follows:
11	SUBCHAPTER D. VOLUNTEER EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES
12	Sec. 78.151. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
13	(1) "Emergency medical services" has the meaning
14	assigned by Section 773.003, Health and Safety Code.
15	(2) "Emergency medical services volunteer" has the
16	meaning assigned by Section 773.003, Health and Safety Code.
17	(3) "Emergency medical services volunteer provider"
18	has the meaning assigned by Section 773.003, Health and Safety
19	Code.
20	Sec. 78.152. LIABILITY FOR PROPERTY DAMAGE. An emergency
21	medical services volunteer or an emergency medical services
22	volunteer provider is not liable for damage to property resulting
23	from the volunteer's or the provider's reasonable and necessary
24	action in providing emergency medical services in relation to the

- 2 Sec. 78.153. LIABILITY LIMITATIONS OF OTHER LAW NOT
- 3 AFFECTED. To the extent that Chapter 74, Chapter 84, or any other
- 4 law limits the liability of an emergency medical services volunteer
- 5 or an emergency medical services volunteer provider in a manner
- 6 that provides more protection than this subchapter, that law
- 7 prevails.
- 8 Sec. 78.154. LIABILITY OF EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES
- 9 <u>VOLUNTEER</u>. (a) An emergency medical services volunteer providing
- 10 <u>emergency medical services is liable for personal injury or death</u>
- 11 arising from those services only to the extent that an employee
- 12 providing the same or similar services for a county would be liable.
- 13 (b) Section 101.106 applies to a claimant in a suit against
- 14 an emergency medical services volunteer as if the emergency medical
- 15 services volunteer were an employee of a governmental unit and the
- 16 emergency medical services volunteer provider were a governmental
- 17 unit.
- SECTION 3. Section 84.003(5), Civil Practice and Remedies
- 19 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 20 (5) "Volunteer health care provider" means an
- 21 individual who voluntarily provides health care services without
- 22 compensation or expectation of compensation and who is:
- 23 (A) an individual who is licensed to practice
- 24 medicine under Subtitle B, Title 3, Occupations Code;
- 25 (B) a retired physician who is eligible to
- 26 provide health care services, including a retired physician who is
- 27 licensed but exempt from paying the required annual registration

- 1 fee under Section 156.002, Occupations Code;
- 2 (C) a physician assistant licensed under Chapter
- 3 204, Occupations Code, or a retired physician assistant who is
- 4 eligible to provide health care services under the law of this
- 5 state;
- 6 (D) a registered nurse, including an advanced
- 7 nurse practitioner, or vocational nurse, licensed under Chapter
- 8 301, Occupations Code, or a retired vocational nurse or registered
- 9 nurse, including a retired advanced nurse practitioner, who is
- 10 eligible to provide health care services under the law of this
- 11 state;
- 12 (E) a pharmacist licensed under Subtitle J, Title
- 13 3, Occupations Code, or a retired pharmacist who is eligible to
- 14 provide health care services under the law of this state;
- 15 (F) a podiatrist licensed under Chapter 202,
- 16 Occupations Code, or a retired podiatrist who is eligible to
- 17 provide health care services under the law of this state;
- 18 (G) a dentist licensed under Subtitle D, Title 3,
- 19 Occupations Code, or a retired dentist who is eligible to provide
- 20 health care services under the law of this state;
- 21 (H) a dental hygienist licensed under Subtitle D,
- 22 Title 3, Occupations Code, or a retired dental hygienist who is
- 23 eligible to provide health care services under the law of this
- 24 state; [or]
- 25 (I) an emergency medical services volunteer
- under Section 773.003, Health and Safety Code; or
- 27 (J) an optometrist or therapeutic optometrist

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- 1 licensed under Chapter 351, Occupations Code, or a retired
- 2 optometrist or therapeutic optometrist who is eligible to provide
- 3 health care services under the law of this state.
- 4 SECTION 4. This Act applies only to a cause of action that
- 5 accrues on or after the effective date of this Act. An action that
- 6 accrues before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law
- 7 applicable to the action immediately before the effective date of
- 8 this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 9 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
