(C) if conferred by a private educational 1 2 institution or other person not described by Paragraph (A) or (B), including a private educational institution or other person that, 3 4 at the time the degree was conferred, was not eligible to receive a certificate of authority under this subchapter and was operating 5 6 outside the United States, a degree that the board, through the review process described by Section 61.3021, determines is not the 7 equivalent of an accredited or authorized degree as described by 8 9 that section.
