A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the salaries of state judges.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 659.012, Government Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 659.012. JUDICIAL SALARIES. (a) Notwithstanding
- 7 Section 659.011:
- 8 (1) a judge of a district court is entitled to an
- 9 annual salary from the state that is at least \$107,000 [justice of
- 10 the supreme court is entitled to an annual salary from the state
- 11 that is at least \$102,463];
- 12 (2) a justice of a court of appeals other than the
- 13 chief justice is entitled to an annual salary from the state that is
- 14 equal to 110 percent of the sum of the annual state salary paid to a
- 15 district judge and the average of the county supplements under
- 16 Chapter 32 that the district judges in Bexar, Dallas, Harris,
- 17 Tarrant, and Travis Counties are entitled to receive [five percent
- 18 less than the salary provided by the General Appropriations Act for
- 19 a justice of the supreme court], except that the combined salary of
- 20 a justice of the court of appeals other than the chief justice from
- 21 all state and county sources may not exceed the amount that is
- \$1,000 less than the salary provided for a justice of the supreme
- 23 court;
- 24 (3) a justice of the supreme court other than the chief

- 1 justice or a judge of the court of criminal appeals other than the
- 2 presiding judge is entitled to an annual salary from the state that
- 3 is equal to 120 percent of the sum of the annual state salary paid to
- 4 a district judge and the average of the county supplements under
- 5 Chapter 32 that the district judges in Bexar, Dallas, Harris,
- 6 Tarrant, and Travis Counties are entitled to receive; and
- 7 <u>(4)</u> the chief justice <u>or presiding judge</u> of <u>an</u>
- 8 appellate [a] court [of appeals] is entitled to an annual salary
- 9 from the state that is \$2,000 [\$2,500] more than the salary provided
- 10 for the other justices or judges of the court [of appeals], except
- 11 that the combined salary of the chief justice of a court of appeals
- 12 may not exceed the amount that is \$500 less than the salary provided
- for a justice of the supreme court[; and
- 14 [(4) a judge of a district court is entitled to an
- 15 annual salary from the state that is 10 percent less than the salary
- 16 provided in the General Appropriations Act for a justice of the
- 17 supreme court, except that unless otherwise provided by law, the
- 18 combined salary of a district judge from state and county sources
- 19 may not exceed the amount that is \$2,000 less than the salary
- 20 provided for a justice of the supreme court].
- 21 (b) Not later than January 1 of each odd-numbered year, the
- 22 commissioners courts of Bexar, Dallas, Harris, Tarrant, and Travis
- 23 Counties shall:
- 24 (1) prepare a written report of the amount of the
- 25 annual supplemental salary to which the judges of the district
- 26 courts having jurisdiction in the respective county are entitled
- 27 under Chapter 32 for the county's current fiscal year; and

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- 1 (2) submit the report to the lieutenant governor, the
- 2 speaker of the house of representatives, and the presiding officers
- 3 of the standing committees of each house of the legislature with
- 4 jurisdiction over state appropriations.
- 5 (c) For purposes of computing the salary of a justice or
- 6 judge under Subsection (a)(2) or (3) for a state fiscal biennium,
- 7 the amounts of the county supplements reported under Subsection (b)
- 8 on January 1 of the year in which the biennium begins must be used
- 9 [To the extent of any conflict, the salary differential provided by
- 10 this section for the combined salary of a district judge prevails
- 11 over any differential set by Chapter 32].
- 12 (d) [In a county with more than five district courts, a
- 13 district judge who serves as a local administrative district judge
- 14 under Section 74.091 is entitled to an annual salary from the state
- 15 that is \$5,000 more than the salary from the state to which the
- 16 judge is otherwise entitled under Subsection (c).
- 17 $\left[\frac{(e)}{e}\right]$ For the purpose of salary payments by the state, the
- 18 comptroller shall determine from sworn statements filed by the
- 19 justices of the courts of appeals [and district judges] that the
- 20 required salary differentials provided by this section are
- 21 maintained. If a salary combined with a county supplement would be
- 22 in excess of the differential provided by this section, the
- 23 comptroller shall reduce the state salary by the amount of the
- 24 excess.
- 25 SECTION 2. Section 659.0125, Government Code, is amended to
- 26 read as follows:
- Sec. 659.0125. SALARY FOR LOCAL ADMINISTRATIVE JUDGE. In a

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- 1 county with more than six district courts, a district judge who
- 2 serves as a local administrative district judge under Section
- 3 74.091 is entitled to an annual salary from the state that is \$5,000
- 4 more than the salary from the state to which the judge is otherwise
- 5 entitled under Section 659.012 [659.012(c)].
- 6 SECTION 3. Section 32.043(a), Government Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (a) The [Notwithstanding Section 659.012, the]
- 9 Commissioners Court of Collin County may budget for and pay the
- 10 judges of the district courts having jurisdiction in the county an
- 11 annual salary set by the commissioners court for services rendered
- 12 and for performing administrative services.
- SECTION 4. Section 32.070(a), Government Code, is amended
- 14 to read as follows:
- 15 (a) The [Notwithstanding Section 659.012, the]
- 16 Commissioners Court of Ellis County may budget for and pay the
- judges of the district courts having jurisdiction in the county an
- annual salary paid by the commissioners court for services rendered
- 19 and for performing administrative duties.
- SECTION 5. Section 32.101(a), Government Code, is amended
- 21 to read as follows:
- 22 (a) The [Notwithstanding Section 659.012, the]
- 23 Commissioners Court of Harris County may budget for and pay the
- judges of the district courts having jurisdiction in that county an
- 25 annual salary of not less than \$12,000 nor more than \$25,000 [in an
- 26 amount set by the commissioners court] for judicial and
- 27 administrative services.

- 1 SECTION 6. Section 32.109(a), Government Code, is amended
- 2 to read as follows:
- 3 (a) The [Notwithstanding Section 659.012, the]
- 4 Commissioners Court of Hill County may budget for and pay the judges
- of the district courts having jurisdiction in the county an annual
- 6 salary paid by the commissioners court for services rendered and
- 7 for performing administrative duties.
- 8 SECTION 7. Section 32.220(a), Government Code, is amended
- 9 to read as follows:
- 10 (a) The [Notwithstanding Section 659.012, the]
- 11 Commissioners Court of Tarrant County may budget and pay the judges
- 12 of the district courts and criminal district courts having
- jurisdiction only in that county an annual salary of \$8,000 [in an
- 14 amount set by the commissioners court for services rendered and
- 15 for administrative duties.
- SECTION 8. Section 32.227(a), Government Code, is amended
- 17 to read as follows:
- 18 (a) The [Notwithstanding Section 659.012, the]
- 19 Commissioners Court of Travis County may pay the judges of the
- 20 district courts having jurisdiction in the county an annual salary
- 21 in an amount set by the commissioners court for services rendered
- 22 and for performing administrative duties.
- SECTION 9. Section 32.246(a), Government Code, is amended
- 24 to read as follows:
- 25 (a) The [Notwithstanding Section 659.012, the]
- 26 Commissioners Court of Williamson County may budget for and pay the
- 27 judges of the district courts having jurisdiction in the county an

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- 1 annual salary paid by the commissioners court for services rendered
- 2 and for performing administrative duties.
- 3 SECTION 10. The following laws are repealed:
- 4 (1) Section 2, Chapter 100, Acts of the 78th
- 5 Legislature, Regular Session, 2003;
- 6 (2) Section 4, Chapter 62, Acts of the 78th
- 7 Legislature, Regular Session, 2003;
- 8 (3) Sections 2 and 4, Chapter 675, Acts of the 78th
- 9 Legislature, Regular Session, 2003; and
- 10 (4) Sections 32.070(c), 32.109(c), and 32.246(c),
- 11 Government Code.
- 12 SECTION 11. Not later than January 1, 2007, the
- 13 commissioners courts of Bexar, Dallas, Harris, Tarrant, and Travis
- 14 Counties shall submit the initial report required by Section
- 15 659.012(b), Government Code, as amended by this Act, to the
- 16 lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives,
- and the presiding officers of the standing committees of each house
- of the legislature with jurisdiction over state appropriations.
- 19 SECTION 12. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
