A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the establishment of a tow truck rotation list in 3 certain counties; providing a penalty.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter E, Chapter 643, Transportation Code,
- 6 is amended by adding Section 643.209 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 643.209. TOW ROTATION LIST IN CERTAIN COUNTIES. (a)
- 8 In this section, "nonconsent tow" has the meaning assigned by
- 9 Section 643.201.
- (b) This section applies only to a county with a population
- 11 of 300,000 or more.
- 12 (c) The sheriff's office may maintain a list of towing
- companies to perform nonconsent tows of motor vehicles initiated by
- 14 a peace officer investigating a traffic accident or a traffic
- 15 incident.
- 16 (d) A peace officer initiating a nonconsent tow of a motor
- 17 vehicle involved in a traffic accident or traffic incident that the
- officer is investigating shall notify the sheriff's office that the
- 19 tow is being initiated. The office shall contact successive towing
- 20 companies on the tow rotation list until a company agrees to carry
- 21 out the tow.
- (e) The sheriff's office may assess a towing company an
- 23 administrative fee to be included on the tow rotation list in an
- 24 amount not to exceed the amount necessary to implement this

- 1 section.
- 2 (f) The sheriff's office shall adopt policies to implement
- 3 this section in a manner that ensures fair distribution of
- 4 nonconsent tows among the towing companies that perform nonconsent
- 5 tows in the county.
- 6 (g) In a county in which a list is maintained under
- 7 Subsection (c), a person commits an offense if:
- 8 (1) the person arrives at the scene of a traffic
- 9 accident or traffic incident to perform a nonconsent tow of a motor
- 10 vehicle without first being contacted by the sheriff's office;
- 11 (2) the person directly or indirectly solicits, on
- 12 streets located in the county, towing services, including towing,
- 13 removing, repairing, wrecking, storing, trading, selling, or
- 14 purchasing related to a vehicle that has been damaged in an accident
- to the extent that it cannot be normally and safely driven; or
- 16 (3) the person enters the scene of a traffic accident,
- 17 traffic incident, or other area under the control of a peace officer
- 18 without the permission of the peace officer.
- (h) An offense under Subsection (g) is a misdemeanor
- punishable by a fine of not less than \$1 or more than \$200.
- 21 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
