- 17 (5) shift differential pay as authorized by Section

- 19 (6) fitness incentive pay as authorized by Section

- 21 SECTION 2. The heading to Section 143.044, Local Government

- Sec. 143.044. CERTIFICATION, [AND] EDUCATIONAL INCENTIVE,

- 4 (d) If the criteria for fitness incentive pay are clearly
  5 established, are in writing, and are applied equally to each fire
  6 fighter or police officer in a municipality who meets the criteria,
  7 the municipality's governing body may authorize fitness incentive
  8 pay for each fire fighter or police officer who successfully meets
- 10 <u>(e)</u> The certification pay, [and] educational incentive pay, 11 and fitness incentive pay are in addition to a fire fighter's or 12 police officer's regular pay.
- 13 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
