- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 54.002, Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 54.002. APPLICABILITY OF CHAPTER. The provisions of
- 8 this chapter apply to all institutions of higher education, except
- 9 that as to junior colleges this chapter applies only to the extent
- 10 provided by Chapter 130 or to the extent that a provision of this
- 11 chapter expressly applies to junior colleges [Section 130.003(b) of
- 12 this code .
- SECTION 2. Section 54.051(n), Education Code, is amended to
- 14 read as follows:
- (n) Tuition for a resident student registered in a public
- 16 junior college is determined by the governing board of each
- 17 institution, but the tuition may not be less than \$8 for each
- 18 semester credit hour and may not total less than \$25 for a semester.
- 19 Tuition for a nonresident student is determined by the governing
- 20 board of each institution but the tuition may not be less than \$200
- 21 for each semester. The governing board of a public junior college
- 22 may set a different tuition rate for each program, course, or course
- 23 <u>level offered by the institution, including a program, course, or</u>
- course level described by another provision of this section, as the

- 1 governing board considers appropriate to reflect course costs or to
- 2 promote efficiency or another rational purpose.
- 3 SECTION 3. Section 54.051(n), Education Code, as amended by
- 4 this Act, applies beginning with tuition charged for the 2005 fall
- 5 semester. Tuition charged for an academic period before the 2005
- 6 fall semester is covered by the law in effect immediately before the
- 7 effective date of this Act, and the former law is continued in
- 8 effect for that purpose.
- 9 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
