## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT
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- 2 relating to the promotion of breast-feeding and the prohibition
- 3 against interference with or restriction of the right to
- 4 breast-feed.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 165.002, Health and Safety Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 165.002. RIGHT TO BREAST-FEED. (a) A mother is
- 9 entitled to breast-feed her baby in any location in which the mother
- 10 is otherwise authorized to be.
- 11 (b) A business entity or an owner or employee of the entity
- may not interfere with or restrict the right of a mother, including
- 13 <u>a mother who is an employee of the entity, to breast-feed in</u>
- 14 accordance with this section.
- 15 (c) The refusal of a business entity to allow an employee to
- 16 exercise the right to breast-feed provided by this section
- 17 constitutes an unlawful employment practice under Chapter 21, Labor
- 18 <u>Code.</u>
- 19 SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 165, Health and Safety
- 20 Code, is amended by adding Section 165.0035 to read as follows:
- Sec. 165.0035. PHYSICIAN DESIGNATION AS "BREAST-FEEDING
- 22 FRIENDLY." (a) A physician licensed to practice medicine in this
- 23 state may use the designation "breast-feeding friendly" in the
- 24 physician's promotional materials if the physician develops a

- 1 policy supporting breast-feeding. The policy must require the
- 2 physician to:
- 3 (1) provide training on the benefits of breast-feeding
- 4 for the physician's staff who provide health care services to
- 5 patients;
- 6 (2) encourage a pregnant patient to breast-feed her
- 7 <u>child after the child's birth;</u>
- 8 (3) provide breast-feeding information and materials
- 9 to pregnant women and mothers with infants;
- 10 (4) provide information on local breast-feeding
- 11 support groups to pregnant women and mothers with infants; and
- 12 (5) provide breast-feeding consultations to mothers
- 13 with infants and contact the mothers by telephone to provide
- 14 breast-feeding information and assistance.
- 15 (b) The physician must submit the physician's
- breast-feeding policy to the department. The department shall:
- 17 (1) maintain a list of "breast-feeding friendly"
- 18 physicians who submit a policy under this section and comply with
- 19 this section; and
- 20 (2) make the list available on the department's
- 21 Internet website and for public inspection at the main office of the
- 22 department.
- 23 (c) The department shall publicize the breast-feeding
- 24 friendly program to all obstetricians, pediatricians, family
- 25 practice physicians, and general practice physicians who are
- licensed to practice medicine in this state.
- 27 SECTION 3. The Department of State Health Services shall

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- 1 develop and make available the list required by Section 165.0035,
- 2 Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act, not later than
- 3 September 1, 2006.
- 4 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
