## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

Τ	AN ACT
2	relating to water conservation.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subtitle A, Title 2, Water Code, is amended by
5	adding Chapter 10 to read as follows:
6	CHAPTER 10. WATER CONSERVATION ADVISORY COUNCIL
7	Sec. 10.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
8	(1) "Best management practices" has the meaning
9	assigned by Section 11.002.
10	(2) "Board" means the Texas Water Development Board.
11	(3) "Commission" means the Texas Commission or
12	Environmental Quality.
13	(4) "Council" means the Water Conservation Advisory
14	Council.
15	Sec. 10.002. PURPOSE. The council is created to provide the
16	governor, lieutenant governor, speaker of the house of
17	representatives, legislature, board, commission, political
18	subdivisions, and the public with the resource of a select council
19	with expertise in water conservation.
20	Sec. 10.003. CREATION AND MEMBERSHIP. (a) The council is
21	composed of 17 members appointed by the board. The board shall
22	appoint one member to represent each of the following entities or
23	interest groups:
24	(1) Texas Commission on Environmental Quality;

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1	(2) Department of Agriculture;
2	(3) Parks and Wildlife Department;
3	(4) State Soil and Water Conservation Board;
4	(5) Texas Water Development Board;
5	(6) regional water planning groups;
6	(7) federal agencies;
7	(8) municipalities;
8	(9) groundwater conservation districts;
9	(10) river authorities;
10	(11) environmental groups;
11	(12) irrigation districts;
12	(13) industries;
13	(14) institutional water users;
14	(15) professional organizations focused on water
15	<pre>conservation;</pre>
16	(16) higher education; and
17	(17) agricultural groups.
18	(b) Each entity or interest group described by Subsection
19	(a) may recommend one or more persons to fill the position on the
20	council held by the member who represents that entity or interest
21	group. If one or more persons are recommended for a position on the
22	council, the board shall appoint one of the persons recommended to
23	fill the position.
24	Sec. 10.004. TERMS. (a) Members of the council serve
25	staggered terms of six years, with five or six members' terms, as
26	applicable, expiring August 31 of each odd-numbered year.
27	(b) The board shall fill a vacancy on the council for the

- 1 unexpired term by appointing a person who has the same
- 2 qualifications as required under Section 10.003 for the person who
- 3 previously held the vacated position.
- 4 Sec. 10.005. PRESIDING OFFICER. The council members shall
- 5 select one member as the presiding officer of the council to serve
- 6 <u>in that capacity until the person's term as a council member</u>
- 7 <u>expires.</u>
- 8 Sec. 10.006. COUNCIL STAFF. On request by the council, the
- 9 board shall provide any necessary staff to assist the council in the
- 10 performance of its duties.
- 11 Sec. 10.007. PUBLIC MEETINGS AND PUBLIC INFORMATION. (a)
- 12 The council may hold public meetings as needed to fulfill its duties
- 13 under this chapter.
- 14 (b) The council is subject to Chapters 551 and 552,
- 15 Government Code.
- 16 Sec. 10.008. INAPPLICABILITY OF ADVISORY COMMITTEE LAW.
- 17 Chapter 2110, Government Code, does not apply to the size,
- 18 composition, or duration of the council.
- 19 Sec. 10.009. COMPENSATION OF MEMBERS. (a) Members of the
- 20 council serve without compensation but may be reimbursed by
- 21 legislative appropriation for actual and necessary expenses
- 22 related to the performance of council duties.
- 23 (b) Reimbursement under Subsection (a) is subject to the
- 24 approval of the presiding officer of the council.
- Sec. 10.010. POWERS AND DUTIES OF COUNCIL. The council
- 26 shall:
- 27 (1) monitor trends in water conservation

- implementation;
- 2 (2) monitor new technologies for possible inclusion by
- 3 the board as best management practices in the best management
- 4 practices guide developed by the water conservation implementation
- 5 task force under Chapter 109, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular
- 6 Session, 2003;
- 7 (3) monitor the effectiveness of the statewide water
- 8 conservation public awareness program developed under Section
- 9 16.401 and associated local involvement in implementation of the
- 10 program;
- 11 (4) develop and implement a state water management
- 12 resource library;
- 13 (5) develop and implement a public recognition program
- 14 for water conservation;
- 15 <u>(6) monitor the implementation of water conservation</u>
- 16 strategies by water users included in regional water plans; and
- 17 (7) monitor target and goal guidelines for water
- 18 conservation to be considered by the board and commission.
- 19 Sec. 10.011. REPORT. Not later than December 1 of each
- 20 even-numbered year, the council shall submit to the governor,
- 21 lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of representatives a
- 22 report on progress made in water conservation in this state.
- SECTION 2. Section 11.002, Water Code, is amended by adding
- 24 Subdivision (15) to read as follows:
- 25 (15) "Best management practices" means those
- voluntary efficiency measures developed by the commission and the
- 27 board that save a quantifiable amount of water, either directly or

- 1 indirectly, and that can be implemented within a specified time
- 2 frame.
- 3 SECTION 3. Subchapter E, Chapter 13, Water Code, is amended
- 4 by adding Section 13.146 to read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 13.146. WATER CONSERVATION PLAN. The commission shall
- 6 require a retail public utility that provides potable water service
- 7 to a population of 3,300 or more to submit to the executive
- 8 <u>administrator of the board a water conservation plan based on</u>
- 9 specific targets and goals developed by the retail public utility
- 10 and using appropriate best management practices, as defined by
- 11 Section 11.002, or other water conservation strategies. For
- 12 purposes of this section, the population served by a retail public
- 13 utility shall be determined on the basis of the population
- 14 estimates contained in the most recent regional water plan adopted
- 15 for the regional water planning area in which the retail public
- 16 <u>utility's service area is located.</u>
- 17 SECTION 4. Section 15.102(b), Water Code, is amended to
- 18 read as follows:
- 19 (b) The loan fund may also be used by the board to provide:
- 20 (1) grants or loans for projects that include
- 21 supplying water and wastewater services in economically distressed
- 22 areas or nonborder colonias as provided by legislative
- 23 appropriations, this chapter, and board rules, including projects
- 24 involving retail distribution of those services; and
- 25 (2) grants for:
- 26 (A) projects for which federal grant funds are
- 27 placed in the loan fund;

- 1 (B) projects, on specific legislative
- 2 appropriation for those projects; or
- 3 (C) <u>water conservation</u>, desalination, brush
- 4 control, weather modification, regionalization, and projects
- 5 providing regional water quality enhancement services as defined by
- 6 board rule, including regional conveyance systems.
- 7 SECTION 5. Section 16.053(g), Water Code, is amended to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 (g) The board shall provide technical and financial
- 10 assistance to the regional water planning groups in the development
- 11 of their plans. The board shall simplify, as much as possible,
- 12 planning requirements in regions with abundant water resources.
- 13 The board, if requested, may facilitate resolution of conflicts
- 14 within regions. The board shall develop and implement a regional
- 15 water conservation assistance program consisting of regional
- 16 conservation coordinators located in each regional water planning
- 17 area of the state to enhance and facilitate water conservation
- 18 efforts in each of those areas. A regional conservation
- 19 coordinator located in a regional water planning area may assist a
- 20 coordinator located in another area.
- 21 SECTION 6. Chapter 16, Water Code, is amended by adding
- 22 Subchapter K to read as follows:
- 23 <u>SUBCHAPTER K. WATER CONSERVATION</u>
- Sec. 16.401. STATEWIDE WATER CONSERVATION PUBLIC AWARENESS
- 25 PROGRAM. The executive administrator shall develop and implement a
- 26 statewide water conservation public awareness program to educate
- 27 <u>residents of this state about water conservation. The program</u>

- 1 shall take into account the differences in water conservation needs
- of various geographic regions of the state and shall be designed to
- 3 complement and support existing local and regional water
- 4 conservation programs.
- 5 Sec. 16.402. WATER CONSERVATION PLAN REVIEW. (a) Each
- 6 entity that is required to submit a water conservation plan to the
- 7 commission under this code shall submit a copy of the plan to the
- 8 executive administrator.
- 9 (b) Each entity that is required to submit a water
- 10 conservation plan to the executive administrator, board, or
- 11 commission under this code shall report annually to the executive
- 12 administrator on the entity's progress in implementing the plan.
- 13 (c) The executive administrator shall review each water
- 14 conservation plan and annual report to determine compliance with
- the minimum requirements and submission deadlines developed under
- 16 Subsection (e).
- 17 (d) The board may notify the commission if the board
- 18 determines that an entity has violated this section or a rule
- 19 adopted under this section. Notwithstanding Section 7.051(b), a
- violation of this section or of a rule adopted under this section is
- 21 enforceable in the manner provided by Chapter 7 for a violation of a
- 22 provision of this code within the commission's jurisdiction or of a
- 23 <u>rule adopted by the commission under a provision of this code within</u>
- the commission's jurisdiction.
- (e) The board and commission jointly shall adopt rules:
- 26 (1) identifying the minimum requirements and
- 27 submission deadlines for the water conservation plans described by

- 1 Subsection (b) and the annual reports required by that subsection;
- 2 and
- 3 (2) providing for the enforcement of this section and
- 4 rules adopted under this section.
- 5 SECTION 7. Section 17.125, Water Code, is amended by adding
- 6 Subsection (b-2) to read as follows:
- 7 (b-2) The board shall give priority to applications for
- 8 funds for implementation of water supply projects in the state
- 9 water plan by entities that:
- 10 <u>(1) have already demonstrated significant water</u>
- 11 <u>conservation savings; or</u>
- 12 (2) will achieve significant water conservation
- 13 savings by implementing the proposed project for which the
- 14 financial assistance is sought.
- 15 SECTION 8. As soon as practicable on or after the effective
- 16 date of this Act, the Texas Water Development Board shall appoint
- 17 the initial members of the Water Conservation Advisory Council, as
- 18 required by Section 10.003, Water Code, as added by this Act. In
- 19 making the initial appointments, the board shall designate five
- 20 members to serve terms expiring August 31, 2007, six members to
- 21 serve terms expiring August 31, 2009, and six members to serve terms
- 22 expiring August 31, 2011.
- 23 SECTION 9. (a) Sections 15.102 and 17.125, Water Code, as
- 24 amended by this Act, apply only to an application for financial
- 25 assistance filed with the Texas Water Development Board on or after
- 26 the effective date of this Act. An application for financial
- 27 assistance filed before the effective date of this Act is governed

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- 1 by the law in effect on the date the application was filed, and the
- 2 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 3 (b) Not later than January 1, 2006, the Texas Water
- 4 Development Board and the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality
- 5 jointly shall adopt rules as required by Section 16.402(e), Water
- 6 Code, as added by this Act.
- 7 SECTION 10. This Act takes effect immediately if it
- 8 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 9 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 10 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- 11 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
