4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 51.0075, Property Code, is amended by 6 amending Subsection (c) and adding Subsections (d) and (e) to read 7 as follows:

(c) Notwithstanding any agreement to the contrary, a [A] 8 9 mortgagee may appoint or may authorize a mortgage servicer to appoint a [perpetual] substitute trustee or substitute trustees to 10 succeed to all title, powers, and duties of the original trustee. A 11 12 mortgagee or mortgage servicer may make an appointment or authorization under this subsection by power of attorney, corporate 13 14 resolution, or other written instrument. [The power of attorney or written instrument must be signed by the mortgagee's 15 representative, acknowledged, and sworn to with a jurat.] 16

## 17 (d) A mortgage servicer may authorize an attorney to appoint 18 <u>a substitute trustee or substitute trustees on behalf of a</u> 19 <u>mortgagee under Subsection (c).</u>

20 (e) The name and a street address for a trustee or 21 substitute trustees shall be disclosed on the notice required by 22 Section 51.002(b).

23 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply to a 24 security instrument or other contract executed on or after the

1 effective date of this Act and to a security instrument or other 2 contract executed before the date of this Act that does not conflict with the changes in law made by this Act. A security instrument or 3 4 other contract executed before the effective date of this Act that conflicts with the changes in law made by this Act is governed by 5 6 the law in effect at the time the security instrument or other contract was executed, and the former law is continued in effect for 7 8 that purpose.
