Subchapter C, Chapter 33, Natural Resources 13 14 Code, is amended by adding Section 33.065 to read as follows: Sec. 33.065. TEXAS COASTAL OCEAN OBSERVATION NETWORK. (a) 15 The Texas Coastal Ocean Observation Network is a cooperative 16 project of Texas A&M University--Corpus Christi, Lamar University, 17 18 the Texas Water Development Board, and the land office. (b) The network shall collect data on natural processes 19 affecting the coast for the purpose of studying, planning for, and 20 21 managing human uses of the coast as they are affected by those natural processes. 22 23 (c) The participating state entities shall coordinate the project with the United States Army Corps of Engineers, the 24

3 (d) The participating state entities may contract and enter 4 into agreements with the United States Army Corps of Engineers, the 5 National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, and other 6 appropriate entities, including private entities, as necessary to 7 carry out their duties under this section.

8 SECTION 4. Chapter 616, Acts of the 73rd Legislature, 9 Regular Session, 1993, is repealed.

10 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
