2 SECTION 4. A reference in another law or an administrative 3 rule to the Texas Industrial Fire Training Board of the State 4 Firemen's and Fire Marshals' Association of Texas means the Texas 5 Industrial Emergency Services Board of the State Firemen's and Fire 6 Marshals' Association of Texas. 7 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
