- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 13.002(c), Election Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- (c) A registration application must include: 7
- (1) the applicant's first name, middle name, if any, 8
- 9 last name, and former name, if any;
- (2) the month, day, and year of the applicant's birth; 10
- 11 (3) a statement that the applicant is a United States
- 12 citizen;
- a statement that the applicant is a resident of the 13 (4)
- 14 county;
- (5) a statement that the applicant has not been 15
- determined mentally incompetent by a final judgment of a court; 16
- (6) a statement that the applicant has not been 17
- 18 finally convicted of a felony or that the applicant is a felon
- eligible for registration under Section 13.001; 19
- (7) the applicant's residence address or, if 20
- 21 residence has no address, the address at which the applicant
- 22 receives mail and a concise description of the location of the
- applicant's residence; 23

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- 1 $\left[\frac{(A)}{A}\right]$ the applicant's Texas driver's license
- 2 number or the number of a personal identification card issued by the
- 3 Department of Public Safety or a statement by the applicant that the
- 4 applicant has not been issued a driver's license or personal

- 6 (9) [(B) if the applicant has not been issued a number
- 7 described by Paragraph (A), the last four digits of the
- 8 applicant's social security number[+] or
- 9 $\left[\frac{(C)}{C}\right]$ a statement by the applicant that the
- 10 applicant has not been issued a <u>social security</u> number [described
- 11 by Paragraph (Λ) or (B)];
- (10) $[\frac{(9)}{}]$ if the application is made by an agent, a
- 13 statement of the agent's relationship to the applicant;
- 14 (11) the city, state, and country of the applicant's
- 15 <u>birth;</u> and
- 16 (12) $[\frac{(10)}{(10)}]$ the city and county in which the applicant
- 17 formerly resided.
- 18 SECTION 2. Section 13.122(a), Election Code, is amended to
- 19 read as follows:
- 20 (a) In addition to the other statements and spaces for
- 21 entering information that appear on an officially prescribed
- 22 registration application form, each official form must include:
- 23 (1) the statement: "I understand that giving false
- 24 information to procure a voter registration is perjury and a crime
- 25 under state and federal law.";
- 26 (2) a space for the applicant's registration number;
- 27 (3) a space for the applicant's Texas driver's license

- 1 number or number of a personal identification card issued by the
- 2 Department of Public Safety;
- 3 (4) a space for the applicant's telephone number;
- 4 (5) a space for the applicant's social security
- 5 number;
- 6 (6) a space for the applicant's sex;
- 7 (7) a statement indicating that the furnishing of the
- 8 applicant's telephone number and sex is optional;
- 9 (8) a space or box for indicating whether the
- 10 applicant or voter is submitting new registration information or a
- 11 change in current registration information;
- 12 (9) a statement instructing a voter who is using the
- 13 form to make a change in current registration information to enter
- 14 the voter's name and the changed information in the appropriate
- 15 spaces on the form;
- 16 (10) a statement that if the applicant declines to
- 17 register to vote, that fact will remain confidential and will be
- 18 used only for voter registration purposes;
- 19 (11) a statement that if the applicant does register
- 20 to vote, information regarding the agency or office to which the
- 21 application is submitted will remain confidential and will be used
- only for voter registration purposes; [and]
- 23 (12) <u>a space or box for indicating whether the</u>
- 24 applicant is interested in working as an election judge;
- 25 (13) a statement warning that a conviction for making
- 26 a false statement may result in imprisonment for up to 180 days, a
- 27 fine of up to \$2,000, or both the imprisonment and the fine; and

- 1 (14) any other voter registration information
- 2 required by federal law or considered appropriate and required by
- 3 the secretary of state.
- 4 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 5 to an application for voter registration that is submitted on or
- 6 after the effective date of this Act.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
