2	relating to the delegation of authority to the executive director
3	or staff of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality and to the
4	appeal of actions of the executive director or staff.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Sections 5.122 and 5.222, Water Code, are
7	amended to read as follows:
8	Sec. 5.122. DELEGATION OF UNCONTESTED MATTERS TO EXECUTIVE
9	DIRECTOR; APPEAL OF EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S ACTIONS. (a) The
10	commission by rule or order filed with the chief clerk of the
11	commission may delegate to the executive director the commission's
12	authority to act on an application or other request to issue, renew,
13	reopen, transfer, amend, extend, withdraw, revoke, terminate, or
14	modify a permit, license, certificate, registration, or other
15	authorization or approval if:
16	(1) <u>all</u> required notice of the application or request
17	for the authorization or approval has been given; <u>and</u>
18	(2) [the holder of or applicant for the authorization
19	or approval agrees in writing to the action to be taken by the
20	executive director; and
21	[(3)] the application or request:
22	(A) is subject to Chapter 2001, Government Code,
23	and:
24	(i) a hearing has not been requested by an

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1 affected person; or 2 (ii) a hearing request made by an affected person has been withdrawn and the affected person has agreed in 3 writing to the action to be taken by the executive director 4 [uncontested and does not require an evidentiary hearing]; or 5 6 (B) is not subject to Chapter 2001, Government 7 Code, and: 8 (i) an objection has not been filed by an 9 affected person; or (ii) an objection filed by an affected 10 person has been withdrawn and the affected person has [become 11 uncontested because all parties have] agreed in writing to the 12 action to be taken by the executive director. 13 14 (b) A person affected by an action the executive director 15 takes on a matter delegated under this section or other law or on a matter with regard to which another law authorizes the executive 16 17 director to take action may appeal the executive director's action to the commission unless the action is a decision: 18 regarding a federal operating permit 19 (1) under Subchapter C, Chapter 382, Health and Safety Code; or 20 (2) specified as final and appealable to a court by the 21 22 commission rule that delegates the decision to the executive 23 director. 24 (c) A person affected by a decision of the executive 25 director on a matter delegated under this section that regards a federal operating permit under Subchapter C, Chapter 382, Health 26 and Safety Code, may: 27

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1	(1) petition the administrator of the United States
2	Environmental Protection Agency in accordance with rules adopted
3	under Section 382.0563, Health and Safety Code; or
4	(2) file a petition for judicial review under Section
5	382.032, Health and Safety Code.
6	(d) <u>To appeal an action of the executive director to the</u>
7	commission under Subsection (b), a person must file with the
8	commission a motion to overturn the executive director's action not
9	later than the 20th day after the date the action was taken. The
10	person must provide notice of the motion to:
11	(1) the executive director; and
12	(2) the applicant, if any.
13	(e) The effect of the executive director's action is stayed
14	until the commission's decision on the motion is final.
15	(f) Except as provided by Subsection (g), the commission's
16	decision on a motion to overturn the executive director's action is
17	final on the earlier of:
18	(1) the date the commission rules on the motion; or
19	(2) the 45th day after the date the motion is filed.
20	(g) The commission may extend the period under Subsection
21	(f)(2) one or more times as needed to allow more time for
22	consideration of the motion. If the commission extends the period
23	for consideration:
24	(1) the commission shall specify the date by which the
25	commission will rule on the motion; and
26	(2) the commission's decision is final on the date the
27	commission rules on the motion.

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1	(h) The commission must provide notice that the commission
2	has extended the period for consideration of the motion to:
3	(1) the person who filed the motion;
4	(2) the executive director;
5	(3) any affected person; and
6	(4) any person who has requested to be on a mailing
7	list for the matter under consideration.
8	(i) If the commission does not rule on the motion or extend
9	the period for consideration of the motion before the period has
10	expired, the motion is considered denied.
11	(j) If a motion is filed to overturn the executive
12	director's action, the period in which an affected person must file
13	for judicial review under Section 5.351 or another law authorizing
14	the appeal of a commission decision begins to run on the date the
15	commission's decision is final under this section. [The
16	commission's authority under this section is cumulative of the
17	commission's authority to delegate its powers, duties, or rights
18	under any other law.]
19	Sec. 5.222. DELEGATION OF EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S AUTHORITY OR
20	DUTY. (a) The executive director may delegate to the executive
21	director's staff any authority or duty assigned to the executive
22	director unless the statute <u>or</u> $[\tau]$ rule $[\tau \text{ or order}]$ assigning or
23	delegating the authority or duty specifies otherwise.
24	(b) An action taken by the executive director's staff under
25	this section is subject to appeal to the commission in the manner
26	provided by Section 5.122 for the appeal of an action of the
27	executive director.

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SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies to an action taken by the executive director of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality or the executive director's staff on or after the effective date of this Act. An action taken before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect at the time the action was taken, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
