## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to mercury contamination in fish and shellfish.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Chapter 436, Health and Safety Code, is amended
5	by adding Subchapter J to read as follows:
6	SUBCHAPTER J. CONTAMINATION TESTING
7	Sec. 436.151. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter, "fresh
8	water" and "salt water" have the meanings assigned by Section
9	66.001, Parks and Wildlife Code.
10	Sec. 436.152. TESTING FOR MERCURY CONTAMINATION. (a) The
11	department shall establish a program to test fish and shellfish
12	living in all bodies of fresh water and salt water within the
13	state's jurisdiction for mercury contamination.
14	(b) The program established under Subsection (a) must
15	provide for periodic testing of fish and shellfish living in all
16	bodies of fresh water and salt water within the state's
17	jurisdiction. The length of time between mercury contamination
18	tests on fish and shellfish living in a particular body of fresh
19	water or salt water may not exceed three years.
20	(c) The program established under Subsection (a) must give
21	first priority to testing fish and shellfish living in bodies of
22	fresh water and salt water that have not previously been tested for
23	mercury contamination by the department. The department must test

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the fish and shellfish for mercury contamination in all bodies of

- 1 fresh water and salt water that have not previously been tested for
- 2 mercury contamination by the department before again testing any
- 3 body of fresh water or salt water in which fish and shellfish have
- 4 been previously tested for mercury contamination by the department.
- 5 <u>Sec. 436.153.</u> <u>DECLARATION</u> OF PROHIBITED AREAS. The
- 6 director shall exercise the director's power under Section 436.091
- 7 to declare a prohibited area if mercury contamination testing of
- 8 fish or shellfish in the area reveals that the level of mercury
- 9 <u>contamination in the tested fish or shellfish renders the fish or</u>
- 10 shellfish in the body of water unfit for human consumption.
- Sec. 436.154. EDUCATIONAL BOOKLET. (a) The department
- 12 shall publish an educational booklet that:
- 13 <u>(1) reports and explains the results of the mercury</u>
- contamination testing program established under Section 436.152;
- 15 (2) lists any fish or shellfish consumption
- 16 advisories, recommended fish and shellfish consumption amounts,
- 17 and fish or shellfish consumption bans issued by the director under
- 18 Section 436.091 or this subchapter; and
- 19 (3) advises consumers of the risks associated with
- 20 eating fish or shellfish from prohibited areas or from a body of
- 21 water with a high level of mercury contamination.
- (b) The department shall update and republish the
- 23 educational book<u>let at least once every three years.</u>
- (c) The department shall provide the Parks and Wildlife
- 25 Department with a sufficient number of the educational booklets to
- 26 allow the Parks and Wildlife Department to distribute a booklet on
- 27 request.

- 1 (d) The department shall advise, by mail or e-mail, all
- 2 public libraries, schools, and medical facilities about the
- 3 availability of the educational booklet and any related Internet
- 4 websites.
- 5 Sec. 436.155. PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT. (a) The
- 6 department shall prepare and issue a public service announcement or
- 7 <u>series of public service announcements for broadcast on radio or</u>
- 8 television to advise consumers of:
- 9 (1) the risks associated with eating fish or shellfish
- 10 from prohibited areas or from a body of water with a high level of
- 11 mercury contamination; and
- 12 (2) places where consumers can obtain more information
- 13 concerning water contamination and fish and shellfish consumption.
- 14 (b) The department shall update and reissue the public
- 15 service announcement or series of public service announcements at
- 16 least once every three years.
- 17 (c) The department shall notify appropriate media outlets
- of the availability of the public service announcement or series of
- 19 public service announcements issued under Subsection (a) and shall
- 20 provide requesting media outlets with the announcement or series of
- 21 <u>announcements.</u>
- 22 <u>Sec. 436.156.</u> RULES. The executive commissioner of the
- 23 <u>Health and Human Services Commission shall adopt rules as necessary</u>
- 24 to implement this subchapter.
- 25 SECTION 2. Chapter 11, Parks and Wildlife Code, is amended
- 26 by adding Subchapter K to read as follows:

1	SUBCHAPTER K. FISH AND SHELLFISH CONSUMPTION ADVISORIES
2	Sec. 11.251. PUBLICATION REQUIREMENTS. (a) The department
3	annually shall list all fish and shellfish consumption advisories,
4	recommended fish and shellfish consumption amounts, and fish and
5	shellfish consumption bans issued under Chapter 436, Health and
6	Safety Code, in the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department Outdoor
7	Annual.
8	(b) The department shall maintain a current list of all fish
9	and shellfish consumption advisories, recommended fish and
10	shellfish consumption amounts, and fish and shellfish consumption
11	bans issued under Chapter 436, Health and Safety Code, in a
12	conspicuous place on the department's Internet website.
13	Sec. 11.252. DISTRIBUTION REQUIREMENTS. (a) The
14	department shall accept delivery of the educational booklet
15	provided to the department under Section 436.154, Health and Safety
16	Code.
17	(b) The department shall require a person selling fishing
18	licenses in the state to provide, on request, the educational
19	booklet published under Section 436.154, Health and Safety Code.
20	Sec. 11.253. PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS. The
21	department shall provide training for all department employees who
22	sell fishing licenses or teach angler education classes concerning:
23	(1) fish and shellfish consumption advisories,
24	recommended fish and shellfish consumption amounts, and fish and
25	shellfish consumption bans issued under Chapter 436, Health and
26	Safety Code; and
27	(2) the risks associated with eating fish or shellfish

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- from prohibited areas or from a body of water with a high level of
- 2 mercury contamination.
- 3 Sec. 11.254. SIGNS REQUIRED. The department shall post and
- 4 maintain signs in the two most widely used languages in the area at
- 5 all public boat ramps providing access to fresh water or salt water
- 6 that is affected by a fish or shellfish consumption advisory or fish
- 7 or shellfish consumption ban issued under Chapter 436, Health and
- 8 Safety Code, advising the public of the existence of the ban or
- 9 advisory.
- 10 SECTION 3. (a) The Department of State Health Services
- 11 shall publish the educational booklet and shall prepare the public
- 12 service announcement or series of public service announcements
- 13 required by Subchapter J, Chapter 436, Health and Safety Code, as
- 14 added by this Act, not later than June 1, 2006.
- 15 (b) The executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 16 Services Commission shall adopt the rules necessary for the
- implementation of Subchapter J, Chapter 436, Health and Safety
- 18 Code, as added by this Act, not later than January 1, 2006.
- 19 (c) The Parks and Wildlife Department shall begin
- 20 publishing the list of all fish and shellfish consumption
- 21 advisories, recommended fish and shellfish consumption amounts,
- and fish and shellfish consumption bans issued under Chapter 436,
- 23 Health and Safety Code, in the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department
- Outdoor Annual not later than September 1, 2006.
- 25 (d) The Parks and Wildlife Department shall begin posting
- signs required by Section 11.254, Parks and Wildlife Code, as added
- 27 by this Act, as soon as practicable, but not later than January 1,

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- 1 2006.
- 2 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
