A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT
relating to the licensing and regulation of certain electricians.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
SECTION 1. Section 1305.002, Occupations Code, is amended
by adding Subdivisions (1-a) and (12-a) to read as follows:
(1-a) "Agricultural use" means a use or activity
involving agriculture, as defined by Section 11.002, Water Code,
other than the processing of an agricultural commodity.
(12-a) "Person" means an individual.
SECTION 2. Section 1305.003, Occupations Code, is amended
by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (d) and (e) to
read as follows:
(a) This chapter does not apply to:
(1) the installation of electrical equipment in a
ship, watercraft other than a floating building, railway rolling
stock, aircraft, [or a] motor vehicle <u>,</u> [other than a mobile home] or
recreational vehicle;
(2) the installation of electrical equipment
underground in a mine and in self-propelled mobile surface mining
machinery and its attendant electrical trailing cable;
(3) the installation of electrical equipment for
generation, transformation, transmission, or distribution of power
used exclusively to operate railway rolling stock or exclusively
for signaling and communications purposes;

1 (4) the installation, maintenance, alteration, or 2 repair of communications equipment provided by a 3 telecommunications provider;

4 (5) the installation, maintenance, alteration, or 5 repair of electrical equipment under the exclusive control of an 6 electric utility, affiliated power generation company as defined by Section 31.002, Utilities Code, 7 electric cooperative, or 8 municipally owned utility and used for communications or metering, or for the generation, control, transformation, transmission, and 9 distribution of electrical energy, and located: 10

(A) in a building used exclusively by a utility
 or affiliated power generation company for those purposes;

(B) outdoors on property owned or leased by the
utility <u>or affiliated power generation company</u>;

15 (C) on public highways, streets, roads, or other 16 public rights-of-way; or

17 (D) outdoors by established rights in vaults or18 on private property;

19 (6) work not specifically regulated by a municipal
20 ordinance that is performed in or on a dwelling by a person who owns
21 and resides in the dwelling;

(7) work involved in the manufacture of electrical equipment that includes the on-site and off-site manufacturing, commissioning, testing, calibrating, coordinating, troubleshooting, or evaluating of electrical equipment, the repairing or retrofitting of electrical equipment with components of the same ampacity, and the maintenance and servicing of

No. 1317 electrical equipment within the equipment's enclosure that is 1 2 performed by an authorized employee of an electrical equipment manufacturer and limited to the type of products manufactured by 3 the manufacturer; 4 5 (8) electrical maintenance work if: 6 (A) the work is performed by a person regularly 7 employed as a maintenance person at the building or premises; 8 (B) the work is performed in conjunction with the 9 business in which the person is employed; and 10 (C) the person does not engage in electrical work for the public; 11 12 (9) the installation, maintenance, alteration, or repair of electrical equipment or associated wiring under the 13 14 exclusive control of a gas utility and used for communications or 15 metering or for the control, transmission, or distribution of 16 natural gas; 17 (10) thoroughfare lighting, traffic signals, intelligent transportation systems, and telecommunications 18 19 controlled by a governmental entity; (11) electrical connections 20 supplying heating, 21 ventilation, and cooling and refrigeration equipment, including any required disconnect exclusively for the equipment, if the 22 service is performed by a licensed air conditioning 23 and 24 refrigeration contractor under Chapter 1302; (12) the design, installation, erection, repair, or 25 26 alteration of Class 1, Class 2, or Class 3 remote control, signaling, or power-limited circuits, fire alarm circuits, optical 27

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1 fiber cables, or communications circuits, including raceways, as
2 defined by the National Electrical Code;

3 (13) landscape irrigation installers, as necessary to 4 perform the installation and maintenance of irrigation control 5 systems, and landscapers, as necessary to perform the installation 6 and maintenance of low-voltage exterior lighting and holiday 7 lighting excluding any required power source;

8 (14) [a person who is employed by and performs]
9 electrical work performed at [solely for] a [private industrial]
10 business[, including a business] that operates:

11 (A) a chemical plant, petrochemical plant, 12 refinery, natural gas plant, natural gas treating plant, pipeline, 13 or oil and gas exploration and production operation <u>by a person who</u> 14 works solely for and is employed by that business; or

15 <u>(B) a chemical plant, petrochemical plant</u> 16 <u>refinery, natural gas plant, or natural gas treatment plant by a</u> 17 <u>person who under a contract of at least 12 months' duration performs</u> 18 <u>electrical work for that plant and:</u>

19 <u>(i) the electrical work is not performed</u> 20 <u>during new construction as defined by rules adopted under Chapter</u> 21 <u>151, Tax Code; or</u>

22 (ii) the person is not working for a 23 contractor that has a principal place of business in another state 24 or territory of the United States or a foreign country;

(15) the installation, maintenance, alteration, or
 repair of elevators, escalators, or related equipment, excluding
 any required power source, regulated under Chapter 754, Health and

No. 1317 1 Safety Code; 2 (16) the installation, maintenance, alteration, or 3 repair of equipment or network facilities provided or utilized by a cable operator, as that term is defined by 47 U.S.C. Section 522, as 4 5 amended; [and] 6 (17) the location, design, construction, extension, 7 maintenance, and installation of on-site sewage disposal systems in 8 accordance with Chapter 366, Health and Safety Code, or an on-site 9 sewage facility installer licensed under Chapter 37, Water Code; 10 (18) electrical work performed on a building, 11 structure, or equipment in agricultural use; 12 (19) the installation, maintenance, alteration, or repair of well pumps and equipment in accordance with Chapter 1902; 13 14 and 15 (20) electrical work required for the on-site assembly of HUD-code manufactured housing or modular housing units, other 16 17 than the installation of service entrance conductors, that is performed by a person licensed as an installer under Chapter 1201 or 18 1202, as applicable, if the work performed is within the scope of 19 the person's license as defined by applicable administrative rules. 20 21 (d) This chapter does not require a political subdivision of this state, including a school district or a municipality, to hold 22 an electrical contractor license or an electrical sign contractor 23 24 license under this chapter to be authorized to employ a person to perform electrical work for the political subdivision. 25 26 (e) Subsection (d) does not exempt an employee of a political subdivision from the requirement of holding the 27

2	SECTION 3. Section 1305.151, Occupations Code, is amended
3	to read as follows:
4	Sec. 1305.151. LICENSE REQUIRED. Except as provided by
5	Section 1305.003, a person <u>or business</u> may not perform <u>or offer to</u>
6	perform electrical work unless the person or business holds an
7	appropriate license issued or recognized under this chapter.
8	SECTION 4. Section 1305.153, Occupations Code, is amended
9	to read as follows:
10	Sec. 1305.153. [REQUIREMENTS FOR] MASTER ELECTRICIAN. <u>(a)</u>
11	An applicant for a license as a master electrician must:
12	(1) have at least 12,000 hours of on-the-job training
13	under the supervision of a master electrician; [and]
14	(2) <u>have held a journeyman electrician license for at</u>
15	least two years; and
16	(3) pass a master electrician examination
17	administered under this chapter.
18	(b) A master electrician may:
19	(1) perform all electrical work, including electrical
20	work performed by a master sign electrician;
21	(2) supervise an electrician;
22	(3) verify compliance with on-the-job training
23	requirements for issuance of a master electrician license, master
24	sign electrician license, journeyman electrician license, or
25	journeyman sign electrician license; and
26	(4) serve as master of record for an electrical sign
27	contractor.

1 SECTION 5. Section 1305.160(b), Occupations Code, is 2 amended to read as follows:

3 (b) A person who holds a master sign electrician license 4 issued or recognized under this chapter may only be assigned to a 5 single electrical <u>sign</u> contractor, unless the master sign 6 electrician owns more than 50 percent of the electrical sign 7 contracting business.

8 SECTION 6. Section 1305.161, Occupations Code, is amended 9 to read as follows:

10 Sec. 1305.161. [ELECTRICAL] APPRENTICE; TEMPORARY 11 <u>APPRENTICE</u>. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), an [An] 12 applicant for a license as an electrical apprentice must be at least 13 16 years of age and be engaged in the process of learning and 14 assisting in the installation of electrical work under the 15 supervision of a licensed master electrician.

16 (b) An applicant for a license as an electrical sign 17 apprentice must be at least 18 years of age and be engaged in the 18 process of learning and assisting in the performance of electrical 19 sign work under the supervision of a licensed master sign 20 electrician.

21 (c) On the request of an applicant for an apprentice 22 license, the executive director shall issue a temporary apprentice 23 license that expires on the 21st day after the date of issuance to 24 an applicant who meets the qualifications established by the 25 executive director.

26 (d) The commission by rule shall set the fee, establish the
27 qualifications, and provide for the issuance of a temporary

1 apprentice license under this section. SECTION 7. Subchapter D, Chapter 1305, Occupations Code, is 2 amended by adding Sections 1305.1615 and 1305.1616 to read as 3 4 follows: 5 Sec. 1305.1615. EMERGENCY ELECTRICIAN LICENSE. (a) The 6 commission by rule shall establish criteria and procedures for the 7 issuance of an emergency electrician license following a disaster, 8 as that term is defined by Section 418.004, Government Code, to a 9 person licensed as an electrician in another state of the United 10 States. (b) An emergency license issued under this section expires 11 12 on the 90th day after the date of issuance. (c) The commission, with the advice of the advisory board, 13 14 may adopt rules that provide for the extension of an emergency 15 license issued under this section. Sec. 1305.1616. CERTAIN APPLICANTS WHO ARE VETERANS. (a) 16 17 The department shall issue a license without examination to an individual who: 18 19 (1) was on active duty in the United States armed forces during the period of March 1, 2004, to June 1, 2004; 20 21 (2) submits an application and any other information required by department rule to the department not later than the 22 90th day after the date the individual is released or discharged 23 24 from active duty in the armed forces; 25 (3) has the experience required for a license under 26 this chapter; and 27 (4) pays the application fee.

1	(b) This section expires January 1, 2007.
2	SECTION 8. Section 1305.168(c), Occupations Code, is
3	amended to read as follows:
4	(c) The executive director by rule shall approve continuing
5	education courses, online continuing education courses, course
6	content, and course providers. The commission may adopt a fee for
7	the administration of the department's duties regarding continuing
8	education.
9	SECTION 9. Section 1305.202, Occupations Code, is amended
10	to read as follows:
11	Sec. 1305.202. SCOPE OF MUNICIPAL OR REGIONAL LICENSE. <u>(a)</u>
12	A license to perform electrical work issued by a municipality or
13	region is valid only in the municipality or region or in another
14	municipality or region under a reciprocal agreement.
15	(b) A person who holds a license to perform electrical work
16	or electrical sign work issued by a municipality or region that
17	elects to discontinue issuing or renewing licenses may apply for an
18	equivalent license under this chapter without complying with the
19	applicable examination requirement if the person:
20	(1) held the municipal or regional license for the
21	preceding year; and
22	(2) submits an application for a license under this
23	chapter within 90 days of the date the municipality or region stops
24	issuing or renewing licenses.
25	SECTION 10. Section 3(k), Chapter 1062, Acts of the 78th
26	Legislature, Regular Session, 2003, is amended to read as follows:
27	(k) This section expires <u>December 31, 2005</u> [September 1,

1 2005].

2 SECTION 11. Section 1305.167(d), Occupations Code, is 3 repealed.

4 SECTION 12. (a) Notwithstanding Section 3(a)(1), Chapter 5 1062, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular Session, 2003, an 6 applicant for a license under that section must apply not later than 7 December 31, 2005, and meet the requirements under that section not 8 later than December 31, 2005.

9 (b) For purposes of the issuance of a license under Section 10 3, Chapter 1062, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular Session, 11 2003:

(1) the executive director of the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation shall accept alternative documentation of on-the-job experience approved by the department if the license applicant is applying for a license in an area in which a municipal or regional licensing program does not exist and is unable to provide proof of on-the-job training certified by a master electrician or master sign electrician, as appropriate; and

19 (2) a person applying for a license in an area in which
20 a municipal or regional licensing program exists is eligible only
21 for an equivalent license issued by the department.

(c) The Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation shall
provide notice of the period extended as provided by this section in
which an applicant may apply for a license under Section 3, Chapter
1062, Acts of the 78th Legislature, Regular Session, 2003, to:

26 (1) all municipal and regional licensing programs in27 this state;

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(2) all counties in this state; and

2 (3) all businesses in this state that sell electrical3 supplies and equipment.

(d) In the notice required under Subsection (c)(1) of this
section, the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation shall
request that the municipal or regional licensing program provide
notice of the extended application period to all persons holding
electrical licenses issued by that program.

9 SECTION 13. This Act takes effect immediately if it 10 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each 11 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. 12 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate 13 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
