3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 3, Article 21.21-11, Insurance Code, is
5	amended to read as follows:
6	Sec. 3. PROHIBITION. An insurer may not make an
7	underwriting decision regarding a residential property insurance
8	policy based on previous mold damage or a claim for mold damage if:
9	(1) the applicant for insurance coverage has property
10	eligible for coverage under a residential property policy;
11	(2) the property has had mold damage;
12	(3) mold remediation has been performed on the
13	property; and
14	(4) the property was:
15	(A) remediated, as evidenced by a certificate of
16	mold remediation issued to the property owner under Section
17	1958.154, Occupations Code, that establishes with reasonable
18	<u>certainty</u> that the underlying cause of the mold at the property has
19	been remediated; or
20	(B) inspected by an independent assessor or
21	adjustor who determined, based on the inspection, that the property
22	does not contain evidence of mold damage.
23	SECTION 2. Section 1958.154(b), Occupations Code, is
24	amended to read as follows:

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(b) If a property owner sells property, the property owner
shall provide to the buyer a copy of each certificate [that has
been] issued for the property under this section <u>during the five</u>
years preceding the date the property owner sells the property.

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5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
