A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the provision of state death benefits to certain 3 employees of the Texas Forest Service. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 615.003, Government Code, is amended to 5 read as follows: 6 Sec. 615.003. APPLICABILITY. This chapter applies only to 7 eligible survivors of the following individuals: 8 an individual elected, appointed, or employed as a 9 (1)peace officer by the state or a political subdivision of the state 10 11 under Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, or other law; 12 (2) a paid probation officer appointed by the director 13 of a community supervision and corrections department who has the duties set out in Section 76.002 and the qualifications set out in 14 Section 76.005, or who was appointed in accordance with prior law; 15 (3) a parole officer employed by the pardons and 16 paroles division of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice who 17 has the duties set out in Section 508.001 and the qualifications set 18 out in Section 508.113 or in prior law; 19 20 (4) a paid jailer; 21 (5) a member of an organized police reserve or 22 auxiliary unit who regularly assists peace officers in enforcing 23 criminal laws; 24 (6) a member of the class of employees of the

No. 1333 1 unit that: 2 renders fire-fighting services (A) without 3 remuneration; and 4 (B) conducts a minimum of two drills each month, 5 each two hours long; 6 (13) an individual who: 7 (A) performs emergency medical services or 8 operates an ambulance; is employed by a political subdivision of the 9 (B) state or is an emergency medical services volunteer as defined by 10 Section 773.003, Health and Safety Code; and 11 is qualified as an emergency care attendant 12 (C) or at a higher level of training under Section 773.046, 773.047, 13 773.048, 773.049, or 773.0495, Health and Safety Code; [or] 14 15 (14) an individual who is employed or formally designated as a chaplain for: 16 17 (A) an organized volunteer fire-fighting unit or other fire department of this state or of a political subdivision of 18 19 this state; a law enforcement agency of this state or of a 20 (B) 21 political subdivision of this state; or the Texas Department of Criminal Justice; or 22 (C) 23 (15) an employee of the Texas Forest Service who: 24 (A) is assigned fire-fighting, fire-prevention, 25 rescue, or incident management duties; and 26 (B) meets or is scheduled to meet the applicable qualifications and training guidelines established by the National 27

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Wildfire Coordinating Group for the performance of the employee's assigned duties.

3 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act relating to 4 the death of certain employees of the Texas Forest Service applies only in relation to a death that occurs on or after the effective 5 date of this Act. Matters regarding eligibility, payment, and 6 benefits under Chapter 615, Government Code, in relation to a death 7 that occurs before the effective date of this Act are governed by 8 the law in effect when the death occurs, and the former law is 9 continued in effect for that purpose. 10

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
