## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the election of the members of an appraisal review

3 board.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Sections 6.41(b), (c), and (d), Tax Code, are

6 amended to read as follows:

- 7 (b) The board consists of three members. However, the
- 8 district board of directors by resolution of a majority of its
- 9 members may increase the size of the appraisal review board to the
- 10 number of members the board of directors considers appropriate.
- 11 The members are elected by the voters of the county for which the
- 12 district is established at the general election for state and
- county officers and serve two-year terms beginning on January 1 of
- odd-numbered years.
- 15 (c) To be eligible to serve on the board, an individual must
- 16 be a resident of the county for which the appraisal district is
- 17 <u>established</u> and must have resided in the <u>county</u> [<del>district</del>] for at
- 18 least two years.
- 19 (d) [Members of the board are appointed by resolution of a
- 20 majority of the appraisal district board of directors. A vacancy
- on the board is filled by appointment by the commissioners court of
- 22 the county for which the appraisal district is established [in the
- 23 same manner for the unexpired portion of the term].
- SECTION 2. Section 6.412(d), Tax Code, is amended to read as

- 1 follows:
- 2 (d) A person is ineligible to serve on the appraisal review
- 3 board of an appraisal district established for a county having a
- 4 population of more than 100,000[÷
- 5  $\left[\frac{(1)}{(1)}\right]$  if the person:
- 6 (1) [<del>(A) has served for all or part of three previous</del>
- 7 terms as a board member or auxiliary board member on the appraisal
- 8 review board; or
- 9  $\left[\frac{\text{(B)}}{\text{)}}\right]$  is a former member of the board of
- 10 directors, officer, or employee of the appraisal district; [or]
- 11 (2) [if the person] served as a member of the governing
- 12 body or officer of a taxing unit for which the appraisal district
- 13 appraises property, until the fourth anniversary of the date the
- 14 person ceased to be a member or officer; or
- 15 (3) [if the person] has ever appeared before the
- 16 appraisal review board for compensation.
- SECTION 3. Section 6.413(a), Tax Code, is amended to read as
- 18 follows:
- 19 (a) An individual is not eligible to be <u>elected or</u> appointed
- 20 to or to serve on the appraisal review board established for an
- 21 appraisal district if the individual or a business entity in which
- the individual has a substantial interest is a party to a contract
- 23 with the appraisal district or with a taxing unit that participates
- 24 in the appraisal district.
- 25 SECTION 4. Section 52.092(d), Election Code, is amended to
- 26 read as follows:
- 27 (d) District offices of the state government shall be listed

- 6 SECTION 6. Sections 6.41(e) and (f) and 6.412(e) and (f),
- 7 Tax Code, are repealed.
- 8 SECTION 7. (a) Appraisal review board members shall be
- 9 elected under Section 6.41, Tax Code, as amended by this Act,
- 10 beginning with the primary and general elections conducted in 2006.
- 11 Members then elected take office January 1, 2007.
- 12 (b) The change in the manner of selection of appraisal
- 13 review board members made by Section 6.41, Tax Code, as amended by
- 14 this Act, does not affect the selection of members who serve on the
- board before January 1, 2007.
- 16 (c) The term of an appraisal review board member serving on
- 17 December 31, 2006, expires January 1, 2007.
- 18 SECTION 8. (a) Except as otherwise provided by this
- 19 section, this Act takes effect January 1, 2007.
- 20 (b) This section and Sections 4, 5, and 7 of this Act take
- 21 effect September 1, 2005.
