## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the funding of a telephone service for blind and 3 visually impaired persons that provides the text of newspapers using synthetic speech. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 SECTION 1. Section 56.021, Utilities Code, is amended to 6 read as follows: 7 Sec. 56.021. UNIVERSAL SERVICE FUND ESTABLISHED. 8 The 9 commission shall adopt and enforce rules requiring local exchange companies to establish a universal service fund to: 10 11 (1)assist telecommunications providers in providing 12 basic local telecommunications service at reasonable rates in high cost rural areas; 13 14 (2) reimburse the telecommunications carrier that provides the statewide telecommunications relay access service 15 under Subchapter D; 16 (3) finance the specialized telecommunications 17 assistance program established under Subchapter E; 18 reimburse the department, the Texas Commission for 19 (4) the Deaf and Hard of Hearing, and the commission for costs incurred 20 21 in implementing this chapter and Chapter 57; (5) reimburse a telecommunications carrier providing 22 23 lifeline service as provided by 47 C.F.R. Part 54, Subpart E, as 24 amended;

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H.B. No. 1340 1 (6) finance the implementation and administration of 2 an integrated eligibility process created under Section 17.007 for 3 customer service discounts relating to telecommunications 4 services, including outreach expenses the commission determines 5 are reasonable and necessary; 6 (7) reimburse a designated provider under Subchapter F; [and] 7 8 (8) reimburse a successor utility under Subchapter G; 9 and 10 (9) finance the program established under Subchapter 11 Η. SECTION 2. Chapter 56, Utilities Code, is amended by adding 12 Subchapter H to read as follows: 13 14 SUBCHAPTER H. AUDIO NEWSPAPER PROGRAM 15 Sec. 56.301. AUDIO NEWSPAPER ASSISTANCE PROGRAM. The commission by rule shall establish a program to provide from the 16 17 universal service fund financial assistance to a state sponsor of a free telephone service for blind and visually impaired persons that 18 19 provides the text of newspapers using synthetic speech. The amount of the support may not exceed the amount necessary to become a 20 21 sponsor or maintain sponsorship. The commission may adopt rules to 22 implement the program. Sec. 56.302. ELIGIBILITY. The commission by rule shall 23 24 prescribe eligibility standards for a state sponsor of a service 25 described by Section 56.301 to receive assistance under the 26 program. 27 Sec. 56.303. RECOVERY OF SURCHARGE. (a) The commission

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shall allow a telecommunications utility to recover the universal
service fund assessment related to the program described by Section
56.301 through a surcharge added to the utility's customers' bills.
(b) The commission shall specify how each utility must
determine the amount of the surcharge and by rule shall prohibit a
utility from recovering an aggregation of more than 12 months of
assessments in a single surcharge. The rules must require a utility
to apply for approval of a surcharge before the 91st day after the
date the period during which the aggregated surcharges were
assessed closes.
(c) If a utility chooses to impose the surcharge, the
utility shall include the surcharge in the "universal service fund
surcharge" listing as provided by Section 56.107.
SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.

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
