13	sign supporting a political party or a candidate who has filed to
14	run for office in that election.
15	(b) Subsection (a) does not prohibit a property owners'
16	association from prohibiting the display of:
17	(1) a sign that:
18	(A) exceeds two feet in width or three feet in

21	(C) has any moving elements; or
22	(D) creates a public nuisance or an impediment to

1 or party.

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
