11	may not charge a potential resident for a criminal history record

13	SECTION 2. Subchapter F, Chapter 411, Government Code, is
14	amended by adding Section 411.1406 to read as follows:
15	Sec. 411.1406. ACCESS TO CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD
16	INFORMATION: CERTAIN INSTITUTIONS. (a) An institution licensed
17	under Chapter 242, Health and Safety Code, is entitled to obtain
18	from the department criminal history record information maintained
19	by the department that relates to a person who is a potential
20	resident at the institution.
21	(b) Criminal history record information obtained by an
22	institution under Subsection (a) may not be released or disclosed
23	to any person except on court order or with the consent of the
24	person who is the subject of the information.
