1-8 relating to the regulation of certain investigators by the Texas 1-9 Private Security Board. 1-10 1-11

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 1702.323, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 1702.323. SECURITY DEPARTMENT OF PRIVATE BUSINESS. (a) 1-13 Except as provided by Subsections (b) and $[\tau]$ (d), $[and (e)_{\tau}]$ this 1-14 1**-**15 1**-**16 chapter does not apply to an individual employed in an employee-employer relationship exclusively and regularly by one 1-17 employer in connection with the affairs of the employer.

1-18 (b) An individual described by Subsection (a) who carries a 1-19 firearm in the course of employment must obtain a private security 1-20 1-21 officer commission under this chapter.

(c) The security department of a private business may not hire or employ an individual to perform a duty described by Section 1-22 1-23 1702.222 if the individual has been convicted of a crime that would otherwise preclude the individual from being registered under this chapter. Although the security department of a private business that hires or employs an individual as a private security officer to 1-24 1**-**25 1**-**26 1-27 possess a firearm in the course and scope of the individual's duties is required to apply for a security officer commission for the individual under this chapter, the security department of a private 1-28 1-29 1-30 1-31 business is not required to apply to the commission for any license under this chapter.

1-32 (d) This chapter applies to an individual described by Subsection (a) who in the course of employment: 1-33 1-34

(1) comes into contact with the public;(2) wears a uniform with any type of badge commonly 1-35 associated with security personnel or law enforcement or a patch or apparel with "security" on the patch or apparel; and [or] 1-36 1-37 1-38

(3) performs a duty described by Section 1702.222.

[(e) This chapter applies to any person who conducts an investigation if the investigation involves a person, or the 1-39 1-40 affairs of a person, who is not employed by the same employer as the person conducting the investigation and the investigation is not 1-41 1-42 conducted on the premises of the employer. Premises of the employer 1-43 include walkways, parking areas, and other areas relating to the affairs of the employer.] 1-44 1-45 1-46

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.

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
