- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 2154.252(e), Occupations Code, is added
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (e) For purposes of Subsection (c), reasonable efforts to
- 9 determine that potential purchasers of fireworks are intoxicated
- 10 may include the use of a device with a deep-lung breath analysis
- 11 mechanism to determine if a potential purchaser is intoxicated.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 2154.303(c), Occupations Code, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 (c) A violation of Section 2154.251(a)(1), (2), (3), (4), or
- 15 (5) that results in property damage in an amount of less than \$200
- 16 and does not result in bodily injury or death is a Class C
- 17 misdemeanor. A violation of Section 2154.252(c) is a Class C
- 18 misdemeanor.
- 19 SECTION 3. (a) The changes in law made by this Act apply
- 20 only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this
- 21 Act. For purposes of this section, an offense is committed before
- the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurs
- 23 before that date.
- 24 (b) An offense committed before the effective date of this

- 1 Act is covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed,
- 2 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 3 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect June 20, 2005, if it
- 4 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 5 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 6 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- 7 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
