## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the appointment of a sheriff, municipal police officer,

3 and firefighter to the Critical Infrastructure Protection Council.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 421.021, Government Code, is amended by

6 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (a-1) to read as

7 follows:

- 8 <u>(a-1)</u> In addition to the members described by Subsection
- 9 (a), the governor shall appoint a sheriff, municipal police
- 10 officer, and firefighter who will each serve as a member of the
- 11 council. The office of the governor shall develop and implement
- 12 application procedures to assist with the governor's selection of
- 13 appointees under this section who are capable of representing the
- 14 interests of law enforcement officers and first responders across
- 15 this state.
- 16 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (a-1), to [To] be
- 17 eligible for appointment as a member of the council, a person must
- 18 be directly involved in the policies, programs, or funding
- 19 activities of the appointing agency, office, or division that are
- 20 relevant to homeland security or infrastructure protection.
- 21 SECTION 2. As soon as possible after the effective date of
- 22 this Act:
- 23 (1) the office of the governor shall develop and
- 24 implement application procedures for selecting appointees from

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- 1 among the sheriffs, municipal police officers, and firefighters who
- 2 are interested in serving as members of the Critical Infrastructure
- 3 Protection Council in accordance with Section 421.021(a-1),
- 4 Government Code, as added by this Act; and
- 5 (2) the governor shall make appropriate appointments
- of the initial sheriff, municipal police officer, and firefighter
- 7 who will serve on the council under that section.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
