A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the exemptions from compulsory school attendance. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 25.086(a), Education Code, is amended to 4 5 read as follows: 6 (a) A child is exempt from the requirements of compulsory school attendance if the child: 7 (1) attends a private or parochial school that 8 includes in its course a study of good citizenship; 9 (2) is eligible to participate in a school district's 10 special education program under Section 29.003 and cannot be 11 12 appropriately served by the resident district; 13 (3) has a physical or mental condition of a temporary 14 and remediable nature that makes the child's attendance infeasible and holds a certificate from a qualified physician specifying the 15 temporary condition, indicating the treatment prescribed to remedy 16 the temporary condition, and covering the anticipated period of the 17 child's absence from school for the purpose of receiving and 18 recuperating from that remedial treatment; 19 20 (4) is expelled in accordance with the requirements of 21 law in a school district that does not participate in a mandatory 22 juvenile justice alternative education program under Section 37.011; 23 (5) is at least 17 years of age and[+ 24

1 SECTION 2. Section 25.086, Education Code, as amended by 2 this Act, applies only to a child who is not exempt from the 3 requirements of compulsory school attendance as of August 31, 2005. 4 A child who is exempt from the requirements of compulsory school 5 attendance as of August 31, 2005, is governed by the law as it 6 existed on August 31, 2005, and the former law is continued in 7 effect for that purpose.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2005.
